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Data handling

- · what data are needed by different participants in the system
- · who collects what, how and when
- · what data gets shared and with whom and what does not
- · what analyses get done and how those analyses get shared
- how data and analyses get used (e.g., to inform where to focus and find ways to improve and/or to reward and punish).

Community and Communications

- <u>Community</u>: building trust by building and supporting (creating where needed) continuous learning and improvement networks for:
 - o Continuous learning and improvement
 - o Collaboration for discovery, continuous learning and improvement, priority setting
 - o Impact decision support services
- · Communications: from whom, to whom, among whom about what, when, how, and how well

Incentives and **accountability expectations**

- <u>Incentive structures</u>: what intergovernmental incentives have worked in the past, what has backfired, how to design future incentives well
- Accountability expectations: what does accountability mean, who needs to be accountable for what and to whom to improve outcomes in equitable, fair ways
