National Academy of Public Administration to Host Conversation with OPM Director Kiran Ahuja

Director Ahuja Will Discuss Challenges Facing Federal Workers & Leaders

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The National Academy of Public Administration's Standing Panel on the Public Service will host a conversation with Kiran Ahuja, Director of the U.S. Office of Personnel Management (OPM), on Friday, December 3rd.

After more than two decades in public service - including serving as OPM's Chief of Staff during 2015-2017 - and executive nonprofit work, Ms. Ahuja was nominated by President Joe Biden to be Director of OPM. She was confirmed by the U.S. Senate on June 22, 2021. Director Ahuja is the first South Asian American and first Asian American woman to lead OPM.

During Friday's meeting of the Standing Panel on the Public Service, Director Ahuja will discuss the accomplishments of OPM since the start of the Administration and describe her plans and goals for addressing challenges facing federal leaders, supervisors, workers, and Human Resource professionals, with a special emphasis on future of work.
