### FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF SYLVANIA, GEORGIA

A vision of a Presbyterian Church in Sylvania was conceived in the mind of Rev. H. L. Sneed in the early 1940's. This vision was caught by the Macon-Augusta Presbytery's Executive Secretary in the early 1950's. A number of visits were made to the field by members of the Presbytery, when the field was surveyed and locations for a Presbyterian Church were discussed. But not until the fall of 1956 was any real fruit of these efforts realized.

At this time some fifteen persons, wishing a Presbyterian Church organized in Sylvania, petitioned the Fall meeting of Presbytery to organize a church. Mr. Sandford Hershey acting as leader of the group, wrote to Rev. H. L. Sneed asking that he come to Sylvania to be their minister and to guide them in this effort.

Mr. Sneed came during November and December and worked for several weeks. He agreed to return later, in the event the Spring meeting of Presbytery ruled to organize the church. Mr. Sneed and Mr. Hershy attended the Spring Presbytery at which time Presbytery appointed a Commission to meet in Sylvania March 10, 1957 to organize the First Presbyterian Church of Sylvania.

The group, up to this time, had met at the Recreation Center where they held regular Sunday School at 10 A. M. and a Devotional service at 11 o'clock.

Feeling that a more suitable place was necessary, the group, after some searching, followed the suggestion of Mr. Sneed and contacted the Masons about using the first floor of their building as a temporary home. This proved to be a happy solution to the problem. It was here that services were then held.

The group was faced with securing some equipment. Mr. Cary White made a table for the Kindergarten, Mrs. J. B. Sanders supplied toys; the women made curtains to partition corners for classes. Some 18 adult chairs and 18 chairs for children were bought. Mr. Counts was asked to select a second-hand piano, and purchase same. Mr. Hinson learned that the First Presbyterian Church of Savannah was willing to donate some ten nice pews. A Communion set was bought. The Hinsons gave two offering plates. Other necessary tables were loaned or made and the building was furnished and ready for use.

On the date of March 10, 1957 the Commission from the Macon-Augusta Presbytery organized the First Presbyterian Church of Sylvania, Georgia.



> The Women of the First Presbyterian Church of Sylvania, Georgia met four times in 1964. Although small in number, and unable to have regular meetings, several things were accomplished.

> The Vacation Bible school was sponsored by the Women of the Church. They also helped to furnish an apartment for one of the Supply Pastors, Rev. D. A. Swicord and Mrs. Swicord. A birthday offering of \$10.00 was given, a Home Mission offering of \$10.00 was given, and \$10.00 was paid on refrigerator for the Church kitchen.

A sign showing an open Bible with a verse of Scripture was made to be used in front of the Church every Christmas. This was designed and paid for by the Women of the Church, and was thought by everyone to be very effective.

At the meetings, everyone took part in the Bible Study, and the Day by Day was used by the members. Also, Thy Will, My Will was made available to the younger members of the Church.

For several months Mr. Ned Iverson served as Supply Pastor, coming down on Sundays from Augusta. The Women of the Church arranged for dinner for him every Sunday.

> On February 19, 1967, ten years after the organization of the First Presbyterian Church of Sylvania, Georgia, the beautiful new sanctuary was dedicated. One month later the Rev. Oliver N. Hamby moved to Sylvania to serve the Church as Pastor. Moving with him were his wife and son, Stanley, who is a college student at Alabama College in Montevallo, Alabama. Mr. and Mrs. Hamby also have a married daughter, Mrs. Sam A Johnson III and a granddaughter, Cynthia Diane in Alabama.

During the year the Church had an increase of fourteen members and a substantial increase in the budget, which was met.

Although not active in May, an offering of \$18.23 was taken up at the Vacation Bible School in June and was sent in to be used in the Birthday Objective of the W O C.

Through the efforts of one of the members, Mrs. H. L. Sneed, a Communion pew was placed in the Church to complete the furniture given in memory of Rev. H. L. Sneed.

Flowers were placed in the Church every Sunday.

The W O C did not grow in numbers, even though new members were brought in, due to the fact that other members moved away. However, more projects were carried out and it is hoped that they will continue to grow in numbers and activity.

The Women of the First Presbyterian Church of Sylvania have one(1) Circle of fifteen(15) members. There were nine(9) meetings in 1969 in addition to the Birthday party in May. Five members attended the District Group Conference in October in Augusta.

At each circle meeting the Chairman on Personal Faith and Family Life told us about the Emphasis for the month from Presbyterian Women. She also ordered and distributed Prayer guides, personal bible reading booklets and mission study books to all circle members.

One of the most rewarding and interesting activities of the W O C was the visits to the local Nursing Home. Recreation for the aged and sick was conducted by W O C members and visits to patients not able to participate were made. Also rewarding was the interest in and the work done by some of the circle members with the Wee Care Center - an organization for the mentally retarded.

Some of the responsibilities of the W O C which were carried out were furnishing flowers for church services, seeing that the church and Sunday school buildings were cleaned regularly and supplies kept in the bathrooms and kitchen. Through the efforts of the members, tile was laid in the bathrooms. In the nursery, a cradle roll chart was prepared, sheets for the baby crib were furnished and laundered. New felt was put in collection plates in the church and new collection baskets were bought for the Sunday school. Last, but not least, clothing was collected and distributed to needy families and some was sent to Thornwell Orphanage.

Toward the end of the year, several families joined the Church, giving the W O C three (3) mew members. This has been a great inspiration and help to the entire church and we have faith that this growth will continue in 1970.

This made a total of eleven (11) meetings, with an average attendance of 7.5 members.

Our total current expenses were \$136.69. Our total to benevolences were \$133.71.

We met our White Cross quota, Our Birthday offering was \$22.50, and our Joy Gift offering was \$77.63. We gave \$25.00 to the local church treasurer for benevelences.

The monthly emphasis was given each month from the Presbyterian Women by the Personal Faith and Family Life chairman. The Bible study was given from the workbook at each meeting. In January Mission study books for all age groups were ordered. These were passed around and read.

We participated in the Pre-Easter services with other Denominations in town. Had a part in the community Thanksgiving service, which meets in a different church each year. Took part in the area wide Crusade for Christ at the local

High Sch ool .

We gave food, clothing, and toys for boxes for low-income families at Christmas. We answered the request from a local Negro church for help with their Christmas boxes for needy families by giving them a large box of food and clothing. Some of us go to the dental clinic for low-income school children one day a month. Most of these children are Negro. Mrs.O.N. Hamby (the Minister's wife) collected her own clothes closet and cleaned, repaired and altered the clothes for several needy families in the winter and spring. We visited the local nursing home four times during the year, contributing funds for recreatation for the patients. We also visited patients unable to attend.

Mrs. Joe Sasser keeps a day kindergarten during the school year in the educational building of the church. The Bible is taught at sometime during the

session.each day.

/ Mrs. Chester D. Flandersttaught a Bible class one day a week at the Wee-Care Center for retarded children during the winter and spring.

Some of the things we are responsible for are flowers in the sanctuary each Sunday, overseeing the cleaning of the sanctuary and educational building, keeping suplies in the kitchen and bathrooms, helping the young people clean the lawns, prune shrubbry, and replant some, Mrs.A.C. Hinson has charge of seeing that there is someone in the nursery each Sunday morning(we take turns), furnish refreshments for the Youth Fellowship meetings on Sunday nights.

We bought a blackboard for a Sunday School class, saw the beautiful new red carpet laid in the sanctuary (we contributed to that last year), the educational building was air conditioned, (by the Sunday School and Church)

EIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH SYLVANIA, GEORGIA WOMEN OF THE CHURCH JANUARY1,1970-December 31,1970 had a planter planted to use in the sanctuary when no flowers were available, and furnished a maid for the nursery during the revival services in July. The Sylvania church will be fourteen (14) years old on March 10,1971. The following item from the Augusta-Macon Stewardship's Facts and Figures showed that Sylvania First from 1960-1969 (with only 4 years with a pastor) had grown from 25 members to 63 members, and from \$46 to \$837 to benevolences. An increase of 1700% - by far the greatest increase of any church in the presbytery. The present pastor is Rev. Oliver N. Hamby, who has been here since March 1967. We hope to grow in faith and spirituality as we enter this new year of 1971 under the leadership of our new president Mrs. G.D.Counts. (the daughter of Rev. Henry L. Cur total expenses were \$159.67. Our total circle offering was \$94.63. Birthday offering \$27.17, Joy Gift Offering \$45.28. We have \$17.50 in a separate fund for tile.

The Bible study in the workbook was used as our guide in the Circle Bible study. The Presbyterian Women was used for the monthly emphasis at some of the meetings. We ordered manuals for the officers and chairmen and had one training session. Bible guides were ordered by the chairman of Personal Faith and Family Life for use during the week of prayer for unity.

We had three ladies to attend the group conference in Augusta at Covenant Church.
We parcipated in the Pre-Easter and Easter Sunrise Services with other denominations in the community. The sunrise service was at our church this year. Some of the ladies served coffee and doughnuts afterwards. We took part in the community Thanksgiving service.

At Christmas the people brought gifts for two needy families instead of exchanging gifts. Small gifts for the youngest were furnished by the church. An old Fashioned Hymn sing was part of our Joy Gift program.

One member Mrs.J.C. Sasser runs a weekday kindergarten during the school year. This

is not limited to Presbyterians.

One member Mrs. Chester D. Flanders has a week-day Bible class for Juniors during the school year. (This is also not limited to Presbyterians) The Members with the help of friends erected a brick and marble bulletin board on the church lawn. We gave our surplus Sunday School literature to a local Negro church. Our biggest project was the presentation of a Honorary Life Membership Pin to

MRS. HENRY LEE SNEED, SR. was a charter member of the Sylvania Presbyterian Women of the Church when it was first organized in April, 1957. She served as Secretary of the first organization. During the following years she has served as Treasurer, Vice-president, Spiritual Growth Chairman, Leadership and Resources Chairman, Christian Community Action Chairman and Historian. She has faithfully fulfilled the duties of these offices, and helped the organization in every way she could.

Mrs. Sneed was the wife of the late Rev. Henry Lee Sneed, Sr., Promoter and first pastor of the church when it was organized March 10. 1957. She is the mother of five children: Mrs. G.D. Counts, Jr., who is the president of the Sylvania Women of the Church now, Mrs. Stanley Booth, Mrs. Lillian (L.O.) Brown, Mr. Henry L. Sneed, Jr. and Mr. William O. Sneed.

Until the first of January 1971, Mrs. Sneed lived in Sylvania most of the time. She is now residing at the Presbyterian Home in Summerville, S.C.. They were active in preparation for and attendance at the Crusade of Revival and Evangelism, April 30 through May 4. A Family Night supper to welcome the visiting evangelist, the Reverend Joe C. Gardner of Paducah, Kentucky, was enjoyed on Saturday, April 29.

The Women of the Church assumed responsibility for having the entire church cleaned and for placing flowers in the sanctuary each Sunday. Beautiful arrangements with significant religious meaning were enjoyed by the congregation on special occations. On the following page there is a photograph of the arrangement done by Mrs. Chester Flanders for the Joy Gift Program. The Joy Gift offering of \$55.00 was sent to the Presbytery for Ministerial Relief. The Birthday of the Women of the Church was observed on May 18 with 22 persons present and an offering of \$30.30 was given for the 1972 Birthday Objective-"Ministry to American, Indian, Afro, Spanish, and Anglo." Mrs. H. L. Sneed, now a resident at Presbyterian Home in Summerville, S. C., was present for the Birthday Program. She recalled that she attended in another state the W.O.C. Birthday Program when it was begun in 1922.

The Women of the Church accepted a White Cross quota for hospital supplies in the Republic of Zaire in Africa. The materials for bed sheets and baby sacques and the postage for mailing amounted to \$14.94.


Tile for the floor in the children's large assembly room in the educational building was bought and installed by the Women of the Church at a cost of \$85.07.

Benevolent giving in addition to that already listed included \$20.00 for Georgia Lodge at Montreat, \$20.00 for Villa International in Atlanta, and \$10.00 for the Presbyterian Home at Quitman, Georgia.

The Women of the Church make provision for a nursery during the morning worship hour. Members of the Women of the Church served as director and as teachers for the Vacation Bible School, July 31- August 4. Mrs. Harold Waters and Mr. Waters provided refreshments at the Vacation Bible School each day.

The membership of the W.O.C. gave of themselves in time and money to promote the total church program and to prepare themselves for more effective service. The Bible Study in the workbook was used at each monthly meeting. The chairman of Personal Life and Family Life gave the devotional at the monthly meetings. Mrs. Oliver N. Hamby was local chairman of Personal and Family Life and was also Presbyterial Chairman of Personal Faith and Family Life. One or more members attended each of the following meetings: Augusta-Macon Presbyterial in March, the Presbytery meeting in April, Synodical Training School in June, Presbyterial Conference in October and the Joy of Learning Workshop in November.

It is the prayer of all the members that through Bible study and working together, we will be more effective witnesses to the saving power of Jesus Christ. our Saviour and our Lord.
