"Adventure is the doing .... the telling comes later." For the past twelve months the women have been quite busy doing, and now it's time to do the telling. The "doings" have been many, and perhaps each service or ministry was an adventure. With the telling now we find that history has been made!

The secretary (Mrs. Joe Holmes) says," Yes, we became a WOMEN of the CHURCH organization of Southwest Georgia Presbyterial this 1955." The women enrolled in the Adel W.O.C. are fifteen (I5) strong, and each has found joy in serving her Lord in many ways, and TOGETHER the women accomplished so much.

Meetings have been held each first Tuesday afternoon of the month, in the homes of members, or at the church. Two (2) members are to be commended for IOO% attendance for the year. We salute Mrs. Joe Holmes and Mrs. E.W.Wright.

"Living the Faith", the Bible Study based on the Book of Romans, was presented each month, in a fine manner, by Mrs. R.T. Wallace, wife of Pastor Wallace.

The Women of the Church have been faithful in publishing good tidings through teaching, serving, giving, loving, praying, and doing.

The women came very near to attaining the I955 SPECIAL GOAL EVERY WOMAN IN SUNDAY SCHOOL. Of the fifteen members twelve are active
in Sunday School - serving as musicians, or teachers, or attendants in
classes. Mrs. E.W.Wright and Mrs. Ben Hutchinson are our musicians for
Sunday School and church. Teachers are Mrs. Gertrude Burney, Mrs. E.W.
Wright, Mrs. Ralph Wheeler, and Miss Dell Beamguard.

In addition to being in Sunday School the women have made it possible for a number of children to attend regularly - by providing transportation Sunday after Sunday. One of the finest contributions made in behalf of the children, is the Catechism Class conducted each Friday afternoon, by Mrs. T.H.Chesnutt. The children come to the church after school and, under the tutelage of Mrs. Chesnutt, study the catechism and memorize portions of the Scriptures. Mrs. Chesnutt is assisted by and memorize portions of the Scriptures. Mrs. Chesnutt is assisted by several of the church women who take turns in coming. Then each Sunday morning the children recite, in assembly, portions of their memory work.

In their ministry to the children the women have provided many pieces of warm clothing and wearing apparel suitable for all seasons and occasions, as well as food and toys on special occasions. An outstanding contribution to the local church was the women's share in remodeling and beautifying the church building. The remodeling provided three muchly needed class rooms, and sheet rock walls, celotex ceiling, and paint for the sanctuary. With floors painted, with walls a soft green, and woodwork all white, the sanctuary is a place of restful beauty.

The Women have had busy times and happy times and sad times,—sad when beloved friends had to move away. Church families must often suffer the loss of faithful members and workers when duties and jobs call them to new fields. It was not easy to give up Rev. and Mrs. R.T.Wallace. Mr. Wallace had served as Pastor for over two years, coming each second and fourth Sundays from Thomasville. Mrs. Wallace had been the Bible teacher for the Women of the Church. (Rev. Wallace came to the Adel Church in February of '53)

The happy times included parties, and a stork shower for Mrs. Ralph Wheeler, a farewell party for Mrs. Wallace. Both of these latter events were at the October meeting of the W.O.C. Of course there was the Christmas party, and other occasions when rthe women enjoyed just being together.

The Adel Women of the Church had splendid representation at the meeting of Southwest Georgia Presbyterial, when it convened in the Thomasville Church, October I3th and I4th. Those of our W.O.C. were Mrs. T.H.Chesnutt, Mrs. Gaines Gaskins, Miss Mary Hicks, and Miss Dora Woods.

The various seasons of Church program emphasis were duly observed by the W.O.C.. Church Paper Week, Dec. 4-IOth, brought in a remarkable invrease of subscribers to the Christian Observer. A record was set - the women made it possible for every church family to receive the weekly issues.

The JOY GIFT Season was an important event, with a special Prayer Meeting service, on the Wednesday prior to Christmas. A very generous contribution of \$ 34 was made. And of course the entire church family enjoyed the annual Christmas Tree and special program. Recitations, songs, Scripture readings, were presented by the Sunday School children, under the direction of Miss Dell Beamguard. From a gaily ornamented tree gifts were presented to all - children and grown-ups. Candy and fruit were an added treat.

In November Rev. John R. Smith came to the Adel Church, to preach, not just twice each month, but every Sunday. The women have indeed been the gracious hostesses and have taken turns in entertaining the entire Smith family - Mr. Smith, Mrs. Smith, Beth, and Raymond. The Smiths reside in Valdosta, where Mr. Smith serves the West End Presbyterian Church, and the Cecil Thompson Chapel.

The I955 Church activities came to a fitting close with a worship service on Christmas morning (Sunday).

The year is past, and for the women many dreams became realities. And now, the women " whose hearts have stirred them up " are ready to step into a brand new year, ready to venture forth in a continuing service for their Master.

Eight attend the W.O.C. Four are non-resident Nine attend Sunday School - Five teach Six have no share in the W.O.C.

The Women of the Church, through monthly circle meetings, continued to project the work of the church through the Bible Study, offerings to the many causes, ministry to the sick and distressed, and through special projects and activities in the Church, Sunday School and out in the community.

Meetings are held the second Tuesday of each month in the homes of the respective members. There is no general meeting since the group is small, and the majority of members teach in the local schools or work in the business world.

The women share in the teaching of the Sunday School classes and in the Circle, using the proposed plan of moderator in the latter group. Sunday School teachers include Miss Delle Beamguard, Mrs. John R.Smith, Mrs. T.H.Chesnutt, Mrs. Ellis Wright, Mrs. Herman Gordon, Mrs. J.H.Parrish, and Mrs. John R.Smith presently serves as S.S.superintendent. Mrs. Ellis Wright is S.S. pianist, and she and Mrs. Ben Hutchinson alternate as the church pianist.

For the Circle the Quitman Home has held special interest, as has Thornwell Orphanage to which special gifts have been contributed. For Quitman Home the special Mother's Day offering, taken together with the church, was \$60.00. For Thornwell a box of special items was collected, in addition to the Thanksgiving offering of \$57.35.

Flowers for the church and meals for the young people of the Youth Fellowship, and refreshments for the Vacation Bible School children have been provided by the Women of the Church.

During the fall, winter and spring months the church pulpit was filled by the Rev. Saunders Garwood, Valdosta State College associate professor of history, and student pastors sent from Columbia Seminary. Rev. Garwood and the student pastors alternated in coming each Sunday. Special events during the year included:

<u>December</u> - The annual Christmas party for the entire church family, with a special Christmas film, a tree for the children and the Joy Gift offering.

MARCH - District II Conference was held in Moultrie int the First Church, and representing the Adel church at the one-day meeting were Miss Mary Hicks, Mrs. T.H. Chesnutt and Mrs. John R.Smith. Mrs. Smith was a panelist on "The Presidents Report".

APRIL - The first wedding in the history of the Adel church took place, when Margaret Elizabeth Smith became the bride of Wiley Parrott of Rome, Georgia. "Beth", daughter of Mrs. John R.Smith and the late Rev. John R.Smith, was the first to marry in the little church, and her father who died October 7,1961, was the first resident pastor of the Adel Church.

A lovely church wedding was performed at 2 p.m., and the Rev. Frank C. King, pastor of the Valdosta First Presbyterian Church officiated at the impressive double ring ceremony.

Thw Women of the Church "showered" the bride-elect at the April Circle meeting.

MAY - The W.O.C.Birthday Party was celebrated at the home of Mrs. J.H.Parrish on South Parrish Avenue, with a special program and birthday offering.

Program participants included Miss Delle Beamguard, Mrs. T.H.Chesnutt, Mrs. Ellis Wright, Mrs. Herman Gordon and Mrs. John R.Smith.

For the three summer months the church enjoyed having a resident pastor and his family - Mr. and Mrs. John Thompson, Robert and Rebecca. Mr. Thompson, a student, formerly at Columbia Seminary, Decatur, and presently enrolled at Erskine Seminary, Due West, S.C., spent his second summer in Adel as pastor of the church.

Arriving on June 10th, the Thompsons resided in the W.L.Dickson home on West 7th Street, within two blocks of the church, until August 25th, at which time they returned to Atlanta.

The Women of the Church showered the pastor's family with pantry goods, and dubing the summer months looked after their needs.

Mr. and Mrs. Thompson served as advisors to the summer Youth Fellowship, with the group of young people and advisors meeting each Sunday evening at 6:30 p.m. for supper in the respective church homes, then back to the church for a meeting, - discussions, singing.

Several picnic suppers were enjoyed on Wednesday evenings at the Union Road Park, located within sight of the church. The church families enjoyed fellowship and prayer meeting in the park.
