Savannah Presbytery Altama Presbyterian Church Brunswick, Georgia

In the early 1960's the Rev. Robert L. McBath, pastor, and the session of First Presbyterian Church of Brunswick, Georgia, saw the need for another church in this area. Mr. Fred E. Smith gave property on the Jesup Highway for a new church, but later it was determined that the need was greater in the North Brunswick area, so that property was sold. However, the idea and interest grew.

On January 22, 1968, the First Presbyterian Church called a meeting of all persons interested in the development of a new congregation in North Brunswick. The meeting was called to define plans and determine interest in the project before starting services. A local planning committee named by the session was composed of; Vernon Evans, D. R. Rozier, Howard J. Brown, Mrs. James L. Jones, Eric Tiller, Charlie George, Joe Blackstock, Hubert Whiddon, Jr., and the Rev. Ben Moore. Hubert Whiddon, Jr., represented the Jekyll Community Presbyterian Church and Rev. Ben Moore the St. Simons Presbyterian Church.

Plans were completed and the committee set initial services for Sunday February 4, 1968 at 9:45 a.m. at the Gibson-Hart Durden Funeral Home on Altama Avenue, with preschool care to be provided in the Lanier room of the First Federal Savings and Loan building. Eric Tiller served as temporary treasurer of the new congregation and Roscoe Odum headed the usher corps. The Rev. Dan Thomas, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church agreed to preach at these services

and otherwise counsel with the Chapel until a permanent pastor could be obtained. The temporary name selected was Altama Presbyterian Chapel. These services were a culmination of joint efforts by the First Presbyterian Church and the Church Extension Committee of Savannah Presbytery. These included a survey of the area made three years ago, and the purchase of a building site on Altama Avenue and Cypress Mill Road, as concrete developments of an idea under consideration for several years.

The initial service held on February 4, 1968 was attended by approximately seventy persons, the colonizing group from First Presbyterian Church, and was the culmination of several months of planning by the committee, named by the session of First Church. At this first service the Rev. F. Clyde Pratt, Executive Secretary of Savannah Presbytery, brought greetings to the new congregation, and joined in administering the sacrament of the Lord's Supper, with the Rev. Dan Thomas, pastor of First Church. Hymnals, a baptismal bowl, and a communion set from the recently dissolved Bona Bella Presbyterian Church in Savannah are being used by the new congregation. At this service, Elizabeth Sinkhorn was baptised and became a communing member of the First Church.

on March 9, 1968, church school classes were initiated at 11:00 a.m., held in facilities of the College Place Methodist Church on Altama Avenue. Charged with overseeing the educational program was a committee composed of Charlie George and Hubert Whiddon, Jr. Those persons enlisted to teach in the Altama congregation classes were: Mrs. T. C. Batten, Jack Gehringer, Mrs. Vernon Evans, Mrs. Roscoe Odum,

Mrs. Will Miller, Mrs. Raymond Harrison and Mr. and Mrs. John Sinkhorn. Joe Blackstock was named church school superintendent.

Presbytery called the Rev. Scott Poole as organizing minister and on August 10, 1968, he began his ministry with Altama Chapel, coming here from West New Bern Presbyterian Church in North Carolina, accompanied by his wife, Rosalie, and two sons, Scotty 12, and Peter 9. Rev. Poole is a native of Troy, North Carolina.

When Savannah Presbytery met in Brunswick on April 15.

1969, the Altama congregation petitioned Presbytery for organization into a church. The petitioners consisted of those who wished to be a part of the new church. New members were received as members of First Church until the Chapel was organized into a church.

At a congregational meeting held April 20, 1969, members of Altama Chapel prepared for organization as a new church. An elections committee including Gerald Thompson, Chairman; Mrs. Howard Brown, Mrs. Vernon Evans, Peter George, Miss Dee Rozier, and Grant Gehringer, was named to make recommendations on the number and kinds of officers. This committee was also asked to serve as the nominating committee.

On April 27, 1969, the congregation voted to name the church the Altama Presbyterian Church.

On May 4, 1969, the Altama Presbyterian Church was formally organized with 97 charter members, with nine petitioners waiting to be received. A commission from Savannah Presbytery constituting the church included the Rev. F. Clyde Pratt, Executive Secretary of Savannah Presbytery, presiding; Rev. Edgar Byers, pastor of Hinesville Presbyterian

Church; Rev. Alden T. Cowen, pastor of Douglas Presbyterian Church; Rev. Ben Moore, pastor of St. Simons Presbyterian Church; Rev. Dan Thomas, pastor of Brunswick First Presbyterian Church; and Elders Bowen Jones of Chapel-in-the-Gardens, Savannah; M. T. McGoogan of Waycross.

At a congregational meeting following the organizational meeting the following Elders were elected; Howard J. Brown, D. R. Rozier, Vernon Evans, Joe Blackstock, Edward Colley, and Roscoe Odum. Vernon Evans was names Clerk of the Session. Deacons elected were T. C. Batten, C. P. George, Charlie George, John Sinkhorn, Gerald Thompson, and Eric Tiller. Treasurer elected was Eric Tiller. Trustees elected were Edward Colley, D. R. Rozier, and Eric Tiller.

On May 4, 1969 the congregation authorized the nominating committee to nominate a pastor, and on May 25, 1969 a motion was made by the nominating committee that the Rev. Scott M. Poole be issued a call to serve as permanent pastor of Altama Presbyterian Church. Motion was carried unanimously. The congregation authorized the nominating committee to sign the call.

On May 25, 1969 the trustees were authorized to purchase a manse, and later the purchase was made. The manse is located at 150 Fairway Oaks Drive, Brunswick, Georgia.

On September 7, 1969 the service of installation of Rev. Scott M. Poole was held at the Gibson-Hart Durden Chapel. The appointed commission members were J. D. Compton, Vernon Evans, Clair Jones, Rev. F. Clyde Pratt, Rev. Dan Thomas, D. R. Rozier, and Rev. Charlie Shedd. Rev. Charlie Shedd, pastor of the Jekyll Community Presbyterian Church preached the sermon.

Following the installation service a reception was held in the Lanier room of the First Federal Savings and Loan building on Altama Avenue.

Officers elected later were Milton Higginbotham, Deacon, on October 19, 1969; Charlie D. George, Elder, on December 14, 1969.

On November 12, 1969 Lamar Alexander was appointed to serve as superintendent of the church school with Vernon Evans, assistant.

In October 1968 the Women of Altama Chapel were organized as a circle apart, but still a part of First Presbyterian Church. Officers of Altama Circle were Mrs. Howard Brown, Chairman; Mrs. Vernon Evans, Co-Chairman; Mrs. James L. Jones, Moderator; Mrs. Joe Blackstock, Social Chairman. Membership included all the women of Altama Chapel.

In October 1969 the Women of Altama Presbyterian Church were organized and officers elected as follows: Mrs. Joe Blackstock, President; Mrs. D. R. Rozier, vice President; Mrs. Scott Poole, Moderator; Mrs. John Wiley, Secretary; Mrs. Roscoe Odum, Treasurer; Mrs. Howard J. Brown, Historian;

Mrs. James L. Jones, Personal Faith and Family Life; Mrs. Norman Stevens, Ecumenical Missions and Relations; Mrs. Vernon Evans, Christian Community Action; Mrs. W. O. Miller, Leadership and Resources; Mrs. John Sinkhorn, Columbia Friendship Circle; Mrs. Lamar Alexander and Mrs. Gerald Thompson, Social Activities. In December, 1969 Mrs. Joe Blackstock moved away and Mrs. D. R. Rozier took her place as president, with Mrs. Roscoe Odum as vice president. Mrs. Howard Jr. Brown Mrs. Howard J. January 1, 1971 found Altama Presbyterian Church still having worship services in the chapel of the Gibson Hart Durden funeral home, with church school at the College Place Methodist Church.

During the year, though the money market was such that we could not undertake building, work went forward on plans for a church building. The building plans committee and the architects, Schlosser and Miller, Inc., continued to work on and revise plans. Working drawings were completed and the job opened for bids.

At the end of the year, Altama Church reported to Presbytery a membership of 123 communicant members, with 9 added on profession of faith, 5 added on reaffirmation of faith, and 17 on certificate. Twenty-two were placed on the inactive list. There were 5 infant baptisms.

The Church School enrolment is 162, with an average attendance of 88.

Our benevolent giving for the year was \$ 3,274.

Summer studies for all members of the church were held at the Shrine Club during July.

At intervals during the year, the pastor, the Rev. Scott Poole, held classes for new and prospective members.

In May, Mrs. James L. Jones attended a workshop in Montreat, as a member of the church council of Savannah Presbytery.

Mr. and Mrs. Lamar Alexander and the pastor participated in the regional church school administration workshop in Montreat in June.

Our Loyalty dinner was held at First Presbyterian Church November 5.

On December 2, 1970 the men of the church were officially organized, and the following officers elected; Leonard Ford, president; Ronald Sutton, vice-president and program chairman; Howard Brown, secretary and treasurer; Committee members named are; Dr. William P. Drew, Randy Rozier, Tom Lee. Meetings are to be held monthly.

At the end of this year, we sadly acknowledge the passing of one of the leading men and charter members of our Church,
Mr. Howard J. Brown.

In the early part of 1973, a great deal of progress was made by various members of the congregation in the area of landscaping and grounds work, with Raymond Harrison in charge. A variety of trees and shrubbery were planted.

On February 4, Altama Presbyterian Church was privileged to hear PCUS missionary, Rev. Charles Alexander of Fortaleza, Brazil.

In helping adults and young adults to avoid a static religious life, and strengthen their Biblical knowledge, Systematic Study was offered at the Church School hour. "Christians in Families" was studied by the Adult Sunday School Class.

Our permanent goal for Altama Presbyterian Church continues to be that of serving Christ both at home and beyond.

1974 was an eventful year for our church, and following are a few of the highlights of the year:

The year 1974 was started at Altama Presbyterian

Church with the knowledge that Naval Air Station Glynco would

be closed by year end. The impact of the base closure was

difficult to assess, initially, but as the year wore on, we were

able more accurately to determine it. This closing we feel in

retrospect is only a temporary set-back to the continued growth

of our church.

The church now sponsors a Cub Pack (Leonard Vsetecka, Cubmaster) and a Boy Scout Troop (Scott Dey, Scoutmaster).

Mr. Eddie Waters of our congregation was appointed Institutional Representative and was instrumental in getting the church to sponsor these boys. Both organizations are open to all boys of the community who qualify age-wise.

In the early Spring of 1974, at a congregational meeting, a motion was made and seconded that a Building Feasibility Committee be established for the purpose of studying the possibility of constructing a new educational building.

Jim McIntire was elected to serve as chairman of the committee and after a series of meetings were held from April through July, it was concluded that such an undertaking was not financially feasible at this time. The committee was, therefore, closed out for the present time.

The Choir has continued to grow and develop under the leadership of Mrs. Frances Shotts as Director. During the year, approximately fifteen choir robes were purchased through donations by members of the choir and congregation. The position of organist for our church was filled by Miss Kim Miller, a member of our congregation.

The Women of the Church have served well this year by providing needed utensils for the kitchen, and, in addition to that, have bought for the Church a complete set of the Layman's Bible Commentary.

The annual Summer Studies program for all ages was held in the second and third weeks of July on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday evenings.

In November, 1974, a beautiful Memorial Book Repository was given by the Eddie Waters family. It was dedicated to the glory of God and in memory of Mrs. Mollie Waters and in honor of Mrs. Youmans (the mothers of Mr. and Mrs. Waters). Memorial gifts are to be permanently recorded there. Mrs. Lucille Brown is custodian of the Memorial Book and notifies families of those to whom memorials have been given.

In the Fall of 1974, work was begun on the annual Every Member Canvass program. Jim McIntire served as Director for 1974 and the Canvass was concluded the last weekend in November with the Annual Loyalty Dinner. The speaker for the occasion was Dr. Fielding Russell, Professor of English at

Geogia Southern College in Statesboro, Georgia. The collection of pledge cards was accomplished on Sunday afternoon and a progress report made to the congregation on the results of the canvass approximately two weeks later. According to the pledges made, the budget was not met but it is the general consensus that the reason for this was the closing of Glynco in combination with the permeating effect of national economic conditions, and that through faith and work by the members, the \$4,779 gap would be filled and the budget met by the end of the year.

At the end of December 1974, Vernon Evans, who has served as Clerk of Session since the inception of the church, rotated off the duty of this office. It was to be permanently recorded in the Session Minutes that much thanks and appreciation was to be given to Mr. Evans for his invaluable service in that position. Mr. Charlie George will succeed him, effective January, 1975.

At the end of September 1974, Lamar Alexander, who also had served as Sunday School Superintendent since the beginning of Altama Presbyterian Church, was succeeded by Jim McIntire. Rev. Poole commended Mr. Alexander for his long and faithful service as Sunday School Superintendent.

Altama Presbyterian Kindergarten is in its second year of operation and is progressing well. Mrs. Marge Evans is Kindergarten Director, and Mrs. Evans, Mrs. Eleanor Miller

and Mrs. Louise Hickox serve as teachers. There is a total enrollment of 60 students with an average of 40 children attending each day. It has been stated that the prime function of the Kindergarten is to serve the community, and to further illustrate this, five scholarships were given by the Kindergarten to children who otherwise might not have been able to participate in the program. Following are a few things which have been done in the past year to improve the Kindergarten:

- (1) Donation by parents of kindergarten students of climbing tower;
- (2) Addition of Peabody Language Kit for language art;
- (3) Addition of new tables, benches and three new cabinets:
- (4) Cleaning and scotchguarding of all carpeted areas in the church.

All of these things are beneficial to our community and church.

In the Session's Annual Statistical Report for the General Assembly, Year Ending Dec. 31, 1974, Altama Presbyterian Church reported a total of 198 communicants.

I was bern in Trey, Mentgemery County, N. C. en 4/3/21.

Influences leading me to the ministry were: a Christian home, Christian friends such as at church conferences and camps, and Christian ministers serving my church or as teachers in seminary. Not the least was my own personal relationship with Jesus Christ in a time of searching for the meaning and purpose of my own life.

My re-birth in the Spirit was a "Timethy" process - gradually. There has never been a conscious time when I did not know Jesus Christ as really as any other member of my family. There have been deep experiences with Him when He directed, called, disciplined, and challenged me. Yet the experience of being "born anew" is a real to me as a Paul type process - sudden and cataclysmic.

What troubles me most in ministry in to see the resistance of some to the call of the Spirit of God. A companion concern is active members who become inactive, as in Galatians Paul asks, "You were rubning well, who hindered you..?" Approximationly A percentage of members of every congregation lapses into inactivity and a departure from commitment.

What gives me most joy in ministry is to see the response of some to the Gespel by commitment and growing Christian lives.

What I'd like to seein my congregation is an openness to God's leading. Two basic questions asked and answered in a positive way by our people will give me real joy. These basic questions are:

1. What is God calling us to do?

2. How shall we do it?

The interview questions are responded to by recall, without having them before me. I hope that this covers the questions of the interview.

Altama Presbyterian Church moved forward in its roll of serving Christ in the community and beyond in 1975 with the following events and highlights of the year:

In March Altama sponsored a Lenten Revival, "OUTWARD FOR CHRIST" with evangelist Rev. John N. Miller, East Carolina University Campus mimister leading the services. It was a rewarding rededication event in our church and we are grateful to Mr. Miller for sharing with us in message and life of the Good News. A most valuable contribution to the spiritual life of our church.

In the spring it was suggested and approved that Altama be open on Wednesday afternoons for the youth in the community during the summer months. Youth activities, under the direction of Mrs George Holt were held. Tennis instructions were enjoyed during these sessions.

In August Vacation Bible School with the theme, "MY CHURCH", was declared a big success. During the one week, our children were taught church doctrine and the expanded work of the church at home and foreign missions. Mrs George Holt and her staff are to be highly commended for their work. Approximately sixty students attended daily.

During August the Memorial Flags that stand in our sanctuary were dedicated to the Glory of God and in memory of Mr and Mrs George Ashmore, Sr. (U. S. flag) and Mr Tom Poole (Christian flag). We are most grateful for these contributions.

As a community service the church sponsors a Kindergarten. We started our third year of operation in September 1975. An average of forty-five children attend five days a week, with a total enrollment of sixty students. This is full capacity for our amount of space. During the past two years, we have given a total of eighteen scholarships. The Kindergarten has been responsible for bringing new members into our church. Mrs Marge Evans, Kindergarten Director, assisted by Mrs Louise Hickox, Mrs W. O. Miller, Jr. and Mrs Earl Brazzell.

In the fall the Women of the Church organized a Morning Prayer Group. This is proving most successful with good attendance and interest.

During the early part of the year, after recommendation from the Session, the congregation authorized a study of the organization of Altamam Presbyterian Church for efficiency of its work.

After much study the Organizational Committee recommended to the Session the Unicamerial System of Government be adopted. The System under one board (a Session of Elders) was approved by the congregation. Three women will be ordained and installed as Elders, a FIRST for Altama. This change will take effect January 1976.

During the Christmas Season the church choir under the direction of Mrs Frances Shotts presented a Christmas Cantata - Peterson's "LOVE TRANSCENDING". Miss Kim Miller, organist.

In the Session's Annual Statistical Report for the General Assembly, Year Ending Dec. 31, 1975, Altama Presbyterian Church reported a total of 21/5 communicants.

The Every Member Canvass moved smoothly under the direction of Thomas Lee and Steve Stevens, with Frank King and William Custer as assistants.

The Women of the Church are increasing their mission in the church and in the community, striving continuously to help more people in and out of the church.

The prayer group organized last year has grown in number and in interest and has now been officially declared the Morning Circle of the Women of the Church with Mrs. Frank King elected as Chairman.

The women function in coordinating family night suppers held at frequent intervals throughout the year for worship, fellowship and entertainment.
