This was done by our Evangelist (Synodical) Rev. M. McG Shields at the close of a meeting held in July. We now request Presbytery to enroll this church." The church was represented by Elder G.C. Williamson at this meeting.

A Daily Vacation Bible School was conducted by Mrs. W.E. Snipes during the summer. She was assisted by Mrs. W.J. Martin and Mrs. J.B. Williamson. Twenty-five were enrolled in this school.

A Prayer Group is conducted for the women in the church by Mrs. J.B. Williamson, Chairman.

A lighting system has been installed during the last year which adds to the attractiveness of the church. Seats and floors should be repaired in the future.

Death of Rev W E Snipes From Christian Observer

Rev William Earl Snipes, pastor of the Midway, Bethel and Mouzon churches in Harmony Presbytery, died at Kingstree, S C on November 11 after a brief illness. Mr Snipes was born in Wallerville, Miss, May 7, 1886. He had been pastor of the Midway church in Clarendon County and Mouzon and Bethel churches, in Williamsburg county, for the last two years. He was a graduate of Erskine College and Seminary at Due West. He had been a Presbyterian minister for thirty—seven years, first in the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church and since 1918 in the Presbyterian Church in the United States. He held pastorates at Magee, Miws; McCrae, Ga; Wade, N C; Cornelia, Ga; Jefferson, Ga and at Anderson, S C. Surviving are his widow, Mrs Ethel Claire Freeman Snipes; his stepmother, Mrs Walker Snipes of new Albany; two sons M P Snipes of Greensboro, N C and J C Snipes, LaGrange, N C; one granddaughter; and three sisters Mrs J A Miller, Miss Gennie Ruth Snipes, Memphis, Tenn and Mrs Ivanona Carter, New Albany. Funeral services were held in the Midway church, conducted by Ref Donald Bailey of Williamsburg church, Kingstree, assisted by Rev Davis Davies of Olanta and Rev Ralph McCaskill of St Charles. Burial was at Old Bluff Cemetery, Wade, N C.

Also in September a combination bulletin and a newsletter was begun. This is printed monthly.

On Sunday, December 21, the children presented a program based on the Nativity Scene.
