Several ladies attended the special Bible study at White B


Bluff Church Sept. 30th.

REV. BILLY FRANK WOODS, PASTOR

Our year began in a most exciting and unusual fashion. At our first meeting we were approached by Mr. George C. Stoney as to our willingness to participate in a film that was being made by the Heart Foundation for public viewing throughout the country. This seemed a challenging and worthwhile way to start the New Year, and we immediately sought our Session's approval. On the last Thursday in January, 1959 we prepared and served a barbeque supper to approximately seventy-five people - this supper serving as background for one of the major scenes in the film. Many of our members were "extras" for the evening and we all enjoyed every moment of it. For all this fellowship and excitement we were paid \$150.60! We shall always be grateful to the late Dr. Robert Giffen for suggesting our congregation to Mr. Stoney.

On February 24, 1959, Bona Bella was privileged to entertain the District Conference of Women of the Church. A record number of women from thirteen churches in the First District attended. We were blessed with a beautiful summer-like day and luncheon was served on the lawn to the overflow crowd.

February 1959 also saw the formation of a new younger women's circle with Mrs. Billy Woods (Beverly) as Chairman. This gave us three active circles.

In March, 1959 a dream of long standing was realized and ground was broken for our new sanctuary. By the time we held our birthday party on April 26, 1959, construction was far enough along for us to serve our refreshments in the "shell" of our new building.

In April, 1959 we also started a "Put a Dollar to Work" project. We borrowed from the Church Treasury enough money for all of our women to have one dollar. The dollars were put to work for a three month period and after paying back the Church Treasury a profit of \$66.75 was realized.

Sunday, June 14, 1959 was a great day for the Bona Bella Presbyterian Church. This was the day that we dedicated our beautiful new sanctuary. Although the attached newspaper clipping gives all the facts, no mere words can express the pride we all felt in this accomplishment. It should also be noted that this wonderful event took place just one year and one week from the time Rev. B.F. Woods came to serve Bona Bella as its minister.

Beautiful new Presbyterian hymnals, purchased by individuals, added a great deal to our worship service. A lovely sterling silver cross, the gift of Mrs. Herbert Harrison, Sr., adorned our communion table for the first time on our dedication Sunday. We were then and still are deeply grateful for the handsome sterling silver collection plates which were given by Mrs. Wholtman.

During the summer months of 1959 plans for renovating our original building were made and carried out. This original structure now houses eight Sunday School classrooms, the minister's study and a kitchen. By the use of cleverly devised folding panels, some of the Sunday School rooms can be made into one large meeting room when the occasion warrants this.

The Fall of 1959 saw Bona Bella sponsoring its first Boy Scout Troop. Mr. George Ball, who has been active in scouting for several years, is our Scoutmaster, and fourteen boys are active in the Troop.

September 10, 1959 saw most all of us our Sunday best attending the long awaited world premiere of "Second Chance", the Heart Foundation movie we had participated in way back at the beginning of the year. What fun it was seeing our barbeque supper being eaten by the leading actors in the movie! What a thrill it was seeing some of our very own people on the screen!

As the Thanksgiving season approached this year we were all deeply aware of the many blessings we have received. Our new sanctuary and renovated educational building are concrete evidence of our progress, but even more heartwarming is the fact that we have thirty-five new church members and also have one hundred and six on the Sunday School roll. These are the statistics that show real progress.

On Sunday, December 6, 1959, Rev. and Mrs. B.F. Woods became the proud parents of a lovely baby girl. What a wonderful prelude to the Christmas season.

Our 1959 Christmas pageant was the lovliest and most inspirational one ever. It was directed by Mrs. Claire Wholtman. Everything about it was perfect. Even the young boys who took up the collection did it with maturity and dignity far beyond their years.

God has indeed been with us at Bona Bella during 1959. As we enter into the New Year we pray that the giant steps taken in 1959 will be matched and then surpassed in 1960.
