THE FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF BOSTON, GA. R. H. Blood. Old Boston om Highway No. 38 seven miles east of Thomasville, Ga. was settled by Major Thomas M. Boston in 1831. In 1832 several Scotch families, including the McIntoshes, McLeods, McKinnons, McMillans and others, located in and around Old Boston. In 1836 they organised a Presbyterian church there and called it McIntosh church. There were eleven charter members but soon others were added. Malcolm McKinnon and John McAuley were the first Elders elected in 1841. Rev. ElimGraves was the first pastor. The first record found of a session meeting was in 1859, with Rev. Joseph Brown, Moderator, J. B. McDonald and Asa Kemp, Elders present. The next session was held a year later with Rev. Francis McMurray ( a nephew of Elder James McMurray, visiting here), as moderator. We could find no minutes except these two, from the date of organization to 1862, when Rev. A. W. Clisby was called to the church, which had been moved to Boston, Ga. on the then Atlantic and Gulf R. R. twelve miles east of Thomasville, Ga. Sixty-four members were recorded between 1836 and 1859 but many of these had died or moved away. Rev. A. W. Clisby came to the church for one Sunday a month in April 1862 and by July, 4, 1862, twelve members were added. Elder James McMurray caused the name to be changed to Bethany, but several years later the Presbytery, meeting here, again changed the name to First Presbyterian to avoid having two churches in the Presbytery with the same name. The church had services once a month until 1899. Since then we have mostly had a full-time pastor. When Dr. Mickel's eyes failed almost completely in 1922, we had

no pastor until I934; duting which time three Elders from the Thomasville church took alternate Sundays and gave us fine talks. The Elders were W. A. Watt, Judge H. J. McIntyre and H. R. Mahler, Principal of Thomasville High School. These were much appreciated by our members and outsiders too.

Dr. Grimshaw took over the church for an afternoon service and prayer meeting, giving the Quitman church full time also. This was in 1934.

In Dec. 1935, Rev. T. P. Burgess took full-time charge of the church and is still our pastor, beloved in town and near-by country not only by his own congregation but by all others who know him.

Just after the civil war, there were no other churches of other denominations near, so the people of other churches attended the Presbyterian church here and contributed to us. When the Methodists and Baptists built their churches, all the people of the town and near-by country helped.

And as all three churches had to call ministers for only one Sunday a month, they each arranged their meeting days so that the members of the other churches could worship with them.

For many years now each has had a pastor's full time, but this fine spirit of Christian unity still exists among all Pastors and denominations.

#### THE AUXILIARY.

In 1874 the ladies of the church formed an Aid and Missionary Society, to which the men also paid dues and sent in the Missionary money through the church. This society continued until it was merged into the general Missionary Society and later into the Auxiliary. As Missionaries, we have tried to help all calls in the Woman's work. We now have only ten members and they include all the ladies of the church who can possibly come or pay. We have several church members who live several miles in the country, whose husbands belong to some other church, or none at all and who take no interest in such matters. These never come or call themselves members of the Auxiliary but send in a dollar or two every year to the church.

#### SUNDAY SCHOOL.

In I866 a Sunday School was established with Elder Hugh Grey as Superintendent. There being no other near-by, other denominations joined with us and we had about ond hundred and fifty pupils and teachers. During this time, a Mr. Freylinghuyson gave seventy-five Bibles for the pupils reciting the Shorter Catechism perfectly in a given time. These were all won, about one-third of them going to children of other denominations. Likewise, a New Testament was given each smaller child reciting the Childs Catechism. The Sunday School sent money to various church causes and orphanages

each year and have kept the banner for Sunday School Extension every year except three since it's beginning.

The infant class enjoy their penny birthday offering every Sabbath.

The Sunday School is now very small and includes only six real children. We have a small but faithful Bible Class and one small class of Juniors.

Our faithful and effficient Bible teacher and Superintendent moves away soon.

In I899, a five-roomed manse was built on Jefferson Street, facing the church. In I908, two large rooms and a bath were added. The church was pulled nearer Jefferson Street and some changes were made and some additions. Elders J. A. Walcott and J. Willis Moore and laymen J. A. Horn and C. H. Carson, Sr. looked after all this work.

In 1936, the plaster in the church began to fall and Elder W. Dent Peeples took charge and had a new roof put on and inside of shurch repaired and repainted.

During the civil war we find recorded the baptism of six negroes, who belonged to the earliest church members. They were received into the church.

The first records of the whurch were torn up and some pages lost, so for several years, we have no official dates.

From 1841 to 1859 there may be some Pastor's name not recorded.

In the fall of 1937, Mr. Coad came to the church at Boston and preaches each Sunday morning, his wife and children coming with him in time for Sunday School. He teaches the Bible Class, also, spends one day a week with us and they visit the members and congregation, also, coming to the Auxiliary whenever it meets.

We consider our church very fortunate in having such a good pastor and only wish "the depression" would allow us to express our appreciation in a more practical manner. His wife also studied to be a missionary, and on occasion can fill the pulpit most acceptably. Their children are loving and obedient, and welcomed in every home.

In the latter part of November the Auxiliary had repairs made on the church to the amount of \$18.00, and in the spring again in the amount of \$17.00. The flower committee planted flowers and shrubs around the church and had water connections made near the church.

The church has 36 members on the roll, only about one half of whom attend regularly or make regular contributions. The church has one or two "get together" parties each year for all the church which are well attended and enjoyed.

The Sunday School has only 19 on roll with an average attendance of 17. We have held the Sunday School banner every year except three since it started. We also have a Sunday School Christmas tree every year for the children. We have a birthday box in Sunday School to which each little tot is happy to put in his or her penny each Sunday, the rest of us contenting ourselves with the annual contribution.

The Bethany Presbyterian Church of Boston, Georgia, called a church meeting in July, 1874, with the object of ceiling and generally finishing the church, which was built before the Civil War. With less than 100 members, we enrolled 44 names on the books that day. Miss Julia McMurry was our first President. Most of our church members lived from one to eight miles in the country, and, as we met at the homes, we hitched old Dobbin to some kind of a vehicle and took one or two representatives of each family and spent the day. About one third of our members were men and children, who sent in their contributions and let the ladies manage, and do the work. When we finished the church building we took on mission work. but sent in the money for some years through the session. We had no seperate report of our mission work. I have not been able to find the dates. Our ladies seemed to think they were all working "now"the past and future did not count. At different times we have dressed orphans, sent in boxes of preserves and pickles to the orphange, helped mountain schools, earthquake, storm and flood sufferes, made and sold quilts, given suppers, dinners and bazaars, and, still holding to our church and mission work, generally doing all the work that the societies usually do; and helping in the church causes and studying the mission fields and their problems. Our church has lost by death and removal until now we have only a few members who joined as children in 1874. We still intend to do all that we can for our church and missions, but see that we cannot take on the budget we have tried to carry for several years. Some day we hope for better times.


