## HISTORY OF THE CENTER PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH Center, Georgia

The Center Presbyterian Church was organized December 6, 1891, by the Rev. Joseph B. Mack, D.D. As the first few pages of the Sessional Record book are missing it is not known how many members were enrolled, or how many or whom the first officers were. Later records are incomplete.

The following is a notation of interest in the Session Book:" At a meeting of Presbytery meeting in April 1898, the Churches of Center, Sandy Creek, Bethaven, consolodated under the name of Sandy Creek Church, the place of worship to be at Center". (page 13)

At hae present time, April 1945, the Center Church is a weak, struggling, Home Mission Church. Preaching services are being conducted by Rev. Pete Phillips, once a month. Mr. Phillips is Superintendent of Home Missions in Athens Presbytery.

Ten members are reported to Presbytery according to Presbytery's minutes.

William Lee Barber was born in Clarke County, Georgia, March 4th, 1865, the youngest son of G.W. and Mary Conger Barber. When about eighteen years old he professed faith in Christ, and united with the Presbyterian Church in Athens, under the ministry of the sainted Dr. Charles W. Lane, for many years its beloved pastor. Before emtering the ministry Brother Barber served the Center Church for some time as a Ruling Elder.

Feeling the call to preach the Gospel, he entered Columbia Theological Seminary in 1893, and completed his studies there in 1896. He was licensed by Athans Presbytery, August 23, 1893, and ordained by the same Presbytery, as evangelist, April 17, 1896.

He served the following churches in Athens Presbytery as supply during the periods mentioned: Homer, Hopewell and Carnesville, in 1897; Center, Jefferson, Thyatira, Comer, Woodstock in 1896; Comer, Danielsville, New Hope and Royston , 1898-1901.

Perhaps in the fall of 1901 he removed to Missouri taking work in LaFayette Presbytery where he served the Saline and Miami Churches, 1902-1903; and Waverly and Saline Churches, 1904-1906.

Returning to Athens Presbytery about 1906, he became pastor of Hebron and Homer churches, also supplying Carnesville and Hopewell churches from 1907-1911. He served Bethaven, Center, Colbert, and Mizpah, 1913-1914.

During the years 1915-1917 he was pastor of the South Broad and Silver Creek churches in Cherokee Presbytery. While in this pastorate, early in 1918, perhaps, his health gave way and he gave up this pastorate which was his last. A while later he returned to Athens Presbytery and did such work as health and opportunity permitted, supplying Bethaven and Bogart Churches, 1920-1922. For the last fourteen years of his life he made his home with his sister, Mrs. J.T. Brown, at Center, and worked in the Sunday School and preached occasionally. He was never married.

Brother Barber was a man of strong mind, wonderful memory, amply endowed with good common sense, quick with and a keen appreciation of humor. These qualities rendered him very interesting in conversation. He was earnest student of God's Word, and he loved to preach it in its simplicity and purity. He found much comfort in the great doctrined of grace; God's purpose to redeem His people by the sacrifice of His Son, and His power to keep His Redeemed through faith unto salvation.

He was regular and faithful in his attendance upon the courts of the church and took a keen interest in the proceedings. He was an attentive pastor and ministered to his people in their homes as well as from the pulpit. Able to see the amusing side of things, his conversation was generally bright and entertaining to an unusual degree. He was a welcome guest among the lowly as well as among those more favorably situated.

He loved God and the Church. He served his day and generation well. He was

The burial was at Center. By his request the sermon being preached by Rev. S.J. Cartledge, with Revs. E.L. Hill, J.R. McAlpine, and J.A. Simpson taking part in the services.
