miles north of the present town of Climax. In 1859, by request the town of Climax, but it was still called by its old name of Mineral Springs Church. Finally, about 1891, the name was changed to Climax Presbyterian Church.

The Church has owned two manses. The first one was built long ago and its use discontinued. The present manse was built beside the Church in 1903.

Following is the story of the founding of the Church, in the exach words of the old minutes:

"The Curry's Presbyterian Church may be reagrded as the offspring of the worthy patriach after whom it is named Duncan Curry, Sr. He was of Scotch descent-born in North Carolina, Robeson Co. from whence he emigrated to Telfair County, Ga. and from thence to Decatur co. in AD 1824. He became a member of the Asbepole Presbyterian Church in which he was born baptised and trained-and was ordained an elder of the Church of Quincy after he pemoved to Decatur Co. Like Abraham he commanded his household after him. He left his mark upon his children. They have reason to bless God, the God of their Father for such a parent. Their mother was of the same. The tunes which she sane of the Soul, the tunes which she sang in the nursery are still after many long years familiar as household words. She died March 21st, AD 1831 and he died February 27th, AD, 1849. They being dead yet speak in and through t eir children now all but two members of the Presbyterian Church. How powerful is parental precept enforced by consistent and babitual example!

STANDARD DEF

It was in the fathers heart to have built a house for the worship of God years before he died but was hindered by various circumstances. His sons carried out their fathers purpose and in 1851 built a neat framehouse 30 by 40 feet, which was dedicated to the worship of God in April of the same year by the Rev. P.P. Smith.

Efforts were made to obtain a minister but in vain until about the middle of December when the Rev. W. H. Crane was engaged to preach the coming year.

Previous to this the following petition was drawn up by C.A. Curry dated November 24th, 1851:

History of Climax Presbyterian Church (April 4, 1947) \*To the Presbytery of Florida, We the undersigned members of wthe Presbyterian Church of Quincy but residents of Decatur County Ga., pray a delefation from your body to come up and organize a Church nine miles east of Bainbridge and appoint the time for the organization to suit the delegati n and give us notice of the same." SIgned, C.A. Curry M.H. Martin Mrs. J.E. Curry Mrs. S.J. Martin Mrs. Francis Bruton Duncan Curry Mrs. M.J. Curry The presbytery granted t is petition and appointed Wm. E. Hamilton and Wm. H. Crane ministers and Daniel Love Elder from the Church of Quincy to execute it. This Presbyterial committee came and organized the above persons together with Archibald S. Curry and his wife Caroline Jane Curry and James Martin the last by letter from Midway Congregational Church liberty County, Ga. All the rest by letter from Quincy, Fla. This organization took place Sabbath morning Feb. 15th, AD 1852. Two of the number were ordained elders. Duncan and Calvin A. Curry by prayer and the imposition of han s. The following children were then babtised: Sarah Ann born April 14th, 1851, daughter of D and M.J. Curry. Henry Chalmers, born Nov. 20th, 1850, son of C.A. and J.E. Curry. Wm. Lawrence born Sept. 28th, 1848 and Chas. born Sept. 29th, 1851-sons of M.H. and Sarah Jane Martin. Mary Elizabeth ,daughter of D.W. and Mary Holliman , members of the Church of Quincy was also at the same time baptised there then no pastor in Quincy. During recess between morning and evening services the session of the Church met--present the Rev. Wm. H. Crane stated supply and both elders, and was opened with prayer.

Curry presented himself as an applicant for admission to the communion for the Church. He was examined as to his knowledge and piety; which being satisfactory he was received. Elder C.A. Curry was chosen Clerk Session and instructed as to his duties--closed with prayer.

The Lords Supper was then solemly celebrated members of the Methodist Church present participated.

HISTORY OF CLIMAX PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (April 4,1947) The meetings in connections with this new enterprise began on Saturday morning previous and closed on Sabbath evening. They were deeply interesting. Rev. Wm. Hamilton preached to great acceptance. Rev. MR. Crane stated the qualifications proper in candidates for the responsible office ruling eldership also in electors. After xxxxxxxx sermons on Saturday morning the elders were then chosen by ballot. The election for Deacons was deferred to some future time. A very interesting prayer meeting was held on Sabbath evening. Elder Love and Deacon Holliman assisted. Addresses were made by the ministers. All the children of the members formerly baptized were recognized as under the care of this church. The last tuesday of February was observed in accordance with the recommendation of the General Assembly by fasting and prayer with reference to the conversion and xxxx calling of young men in schools and colleges to the holy ministry. The first Sabbath of March was observed by holding a monthly concert for the conversion of the world. Five dollars were contributed to Domestic Missions. March 14th, 1852 The session met at Mr. Hibbarts in Bainbridge. All present-Rev. W.H. Crane presided as Moderator-opeded with prayer. Elder D. Curry was appointed to represent Church in presbytery at its ensuing meeting at Iawuonia. Pres. Clu. Leon Co., Fla. on the first of April-closed with prayer. C.A. Curry, Clerk of Sessions
