HISTORY OF THE CLINCHFIELD PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH. Fall 1926. Rev. J. W. Smith, Supt. of Home Missions of Macon Presbytery secured permission from the superintendent of the Clinchfield Portland Cement C., Inc., to begin religious work at Clinchfield, Ga. A cottage was given and prepared so that the work might be carried on. A Sunday School was organized and a revival held by Rev. J. W. Smith.

January 1927. Elizabeth Smith, a Synodical Sunday School Extension worker, was sent to carry on the work.

March 1931. Rev. Ralph Gillam, D.D., Synodical Evangelist, came to build a church.

May 10, 1931. The Clinchfield Presbyterian Church was dedicated. The ministers present were:

> Rev. C. F. Allen, Macon, Ga. Rev. W. R. Mackay, Macon, Ga. Rev. Grimshaw, Fort Valley, Ga. Rev. J. W. Smith, Fort Valley, Ga. Rev. Ralph Gillam, D.D., Atlanta, Ga.

May 18, 1931. Rev. J. W. Smith conducted a revival service for five days. On the evening of May 22, 1931 the church was organized. Rev. J. B. Fricklen, D.D., Decatur, Ga., Executive Sec. of Synod's Work, and Rev. C. J. Allen of Macon, Ga. were present. Rev. Fricklen preached the sermon. There were ten charter members received into the church.

The Synodical Workers in this field have been as follows:

January 1927-February 1928 - Elizabeth Smith, McDonough, Ga. February 1928-November 1928 - Lena Jackson, Atlanta, Ga. January 1929-November 1933 - Elizabeth Smith

May 1932. Rev. E. P. Moye, a graduate of Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary, Louisville, Ky., came to take over the pastoral work of the church in connection with several other churches. Miss Elizabeth L. Smith continued to serve as Synodical Worker until November 1, 1933, at which time she was transferred after several years of faithful pioneer work in establishing the religious life of the community. After her departure, in order to organize the work better, a plan of work was agreed upon by the Cement Company officials, the pastor, the people, and the Home Mission Committee of Macon Presbytery whereby the church would become a community church. The plan proved workable and with the assistance of Sunday School teachers from Perry the work continued to go forward.

Rev. Moye resigned from the work September 8, 1935 in order to take graduate work in Theology at Union Theological Seminary, New York City. He returned at the call of the church and began work again on May 22, 1936. Rev. Moye served until December 1, 1937 at which time he resigned to accept the pastorate of the Watts Mill and Todd Memorial Churches in Laurens, S. C.

Rev. W. C. Sistar, pastor of the Fort Valley Presbyterian Church served until May 1939. At that time, Rev. Robert F. Boyd, a graduate of Columbia Seminary, Decatur, Ga., became pastor.

Miss Elizabeth Smith was the Sunday School Extension Worker for the Synod of Central Georgia in the Macon Presbytery. She served one year 1927 - 1928; Miss Smith was replaced by Miss Lena Jackson (Mrs. Joseph B. Rudolph) for one year. Miss Smith returned in 1930. This was the beginning of the Clinchfield Presbyterian Church.

In May 1932 Rev. E. P. Moye, a graduate of Louisville, Kentucky Presbyterian Theological Seminary, served as the first regular pastor at Clinchfield. Rev. Moye resigned September 1935 to take post graduate work at Union Theological Seminary, New York, N. Y. In May 1936 Rev. Moye returned as pastor until December 1, 1937.

She was assisted by Mrs. Davis, Secretary of Literature, Wayside, Georgia, and Mrs. E. B. Ellison, District Chairman, Wayside, Georgia. The following officers were elected:

Two meetings are held each month, one on the first Monday night of the month, which is our business meeting, and the second on the second Monday night of the month, at which time we study our Bible Literature.

The President, Mrs. Harry Thompson, attended the Auxiliary Training School at Wesleyan College, Macon, Ga., June 29, 1948. The information obtained by Mrs. Thompson at this School was of great help to us. At our next meeting, July 5, 1948, she gave a complete report on the work of the School, at which she specialized in "Program Building" and "How to Study the Bible". Mrs. Thompson gave an outline on "How to Study the Bible", which has been a wonderful help to each member.

On July 20, 1948, The Women's Auxiliary entertained the members of the Macon Presbytery, which held its summer meeting at the Clinchfield Presbyterian Church, with a fried chicken luncheon.

Our Organization instituted cottage prayermeetings on July 23, 1948. It is the duty of each member to lead the prayermeeting when it is held at her home. We have received many blessings from these meetings, and we feel that we can truthfully say that we are a prayerful group. The month of August was a very busy one for us. Rev. David Martin conducted a week's revival service, and Rev. Martin and the revival were of great help to our Church and the community. The week following the revival services we held a 101 804-13P (I) U.S.A. very successful Daily Vacation Bible School. In the month of September we contributed to the White Cross. Also in this month we were notified that the name of the organization had been changed from "The Women's Auxiliary" to "The Women of the Church". "The Women of the Church" contributed to Thornwell Orphanage along with our Church and Sunday School in November. Our Special Home Mission Program, "On Our Own Door Step", was also given in November by Mrs. Jeff Smith, and was read by each member individually. Mrs. Roland Hitchcock was our honor guest. A special offering of \$15.00 was contributed by the eleven members present. Those attending the District Conference in Perry Nov. 14, 1948 were Mrs. Harry Thompson, Mrs. Cecil McCraven, Mrs. R. F. Brantley and Mrs. Harold Huff. Mrs. Thompson reported on Stewardship.

We were very busy in December preparing baskets, trays and other things for the needy families in our community. We also took part in the Christmas Program and the Love Supper, in both of which our Church joined with the neighboring Churches.

At the January business meeting we re-elected some officers. It was felt that this would be best, since we had only been organized for a few months. Due to illness Mrs. Glea Gray was unable to continue the duties of Chairman of Christian Relations, and Miss Betty Smith was elected to serve in her place.

Our Foreign Mission Program was held in January and February, the subject being "High Lights on Mission Works" in the Far East (China, Japan and Korea), and also conditions in Africa. Our special offering at this time was \$14.00. We met with The Women of the Church of Perry, Georgia, for the same program.

Mrs. James Taylor, Chairman of Spiritual Life, gave us part of the Book of Exodus, a work which we hope to complete.

The most interesting and outstanding work of the year were our gifts, donations and social service work. The last included gifts, trays, sending cards, and other little attentions to shut-in of our Church and the community.

At present our membership consists of fifteen enrolled, eleven active. We hope to increase our membership during the ensuing year.



Committee on Trays, Flowers and Visiting(Mrs. C. A. McCraven The year's study and work began in much the same manner as in the preceding years. Two meetings each month, General Meeting and the Bible Study. Mrs. J. A. Grubb, Spiritual Growth Chairman, a very capable and inspirational Bible teacher, having been our Spiritual leader for six years, and also the Adult Bible Class teacher in our Sunday School for five years.

World Mission season was observed with a program covering the eight foreign mission fields. Offering taken for foreign missions and sent in to World Mission Board \$26.00

White Cross quota met. 10 hand towels and the necessary cash for shipping were sent at the stated time Mrs. Ben L. Jones, Augusta, Ga., White Cross Chairman.

The fee of \$1.25 was sent to Synodical Training School.

An interesting program was presented for the Birthday Objective and the offering was \$16.50.

Blessing Box yielded \$6.00 which was mailed in at the proper time. For Church Extension \$3.00 mailed in. Total amount for Christian Social Service was \$31.75. A gift of \$26.00 was sent to Quitman Home. Donations from different members to buy five of a group much needed chairs for the Home was also given at Christmas time.

A small gift of \$5.59 was sent to Thornwell Orphanage.

Mrs. J. S. Harvard attended the District Conference held in the Tattnall Square Presbyterian Church, Macon, Georgia. She gave an interesting report from this conference upon her return.

Several members of our group took one dollar and made in grow both by investing and working. Others of the group gave of their daily earnings to purchase three gas heaters and a 200 gallon tank. The heaters were installed in the church annex. The total expense of the heaters and tank was \$200.00, and of this amount the Women of the Church gave \$150.00.

Venitian Blinds were also installed enveloven windows of the church annex at a cost of \$27.50. This fund was slowly raised by small donations from time to time and put in the "Blind Jar" until we had raised the full amount.

The Church financed the expense of two large burlap curtains to cut off Sunday School Classrooms in the annex. These were made by one of our members, and with the help of her husband were hung.

Five new additions to the Church resulted from a five days revival held in March.

J. Marvin Taylor, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. M. Taylor, dedicated himself to full time service for the Lord, and began preparing himself for the ministry at Columbia Theological Seminary, Decatur, Georgia.

Daily Vacation Bible School was held through June 13th-June17th, from one O'clock to fourO'clock each day. Children from the neighboring churches were invited and many attended. Maximum attendance was 74 for one day and the average daily attendance was 67. Good fellowship, co-operation and Christian influence prevailed. Women of the Church served lemonade and cookies at 3:30 each afternoon.

A Choir was organized in the late summer by the Young People and their leader, Mrs. C. E. Davis, Jr. Rev. and Mrs Stewart donated material for choir robes, and the Women of the Church cut and made them.

Those attending Presbyterial October 14th in the Presbyterian Church in Fort Valley were Mrs. J. M. Taylor, Mrs. C. E. Davis, Jr. and Mrs. C. A. McCraven.

October was Bible Mastery month and the Book of Titus was read a total of 76 times by the members of the group.

A Special Mission Service held in Perry Presbyterian Church was attended by several of the ladies. The speaker was Rev. A. Rodriquez, former missionary, and now from Ybor City, (Tampa) Florida. He gave a very interesting talk.

A clothes hamper of food and supplies was made up and carried to an elderly couple for Thanksgiving.

Throughout the year visits, trays and gifts to the sick were not neglected.

Christmas was observed with a fellowship supper as usual, the entire community being invited to come and take part. Everyone was requested to bring food sufficient for their families and a bit over in case of possible visitors. After supper gifts from the Christmas Tree were exchanged.

Donations were brought and a box of food, fruits, candies, toys and used clothing was made up and taken to a large, needy colored family.
