History Of

Cloudland Mission copied from leaflet sent out in 1934.

"Eight years ago we had no services at Cloudland. A number of people decided that it was badly needed and anunion Sunday School was organized.

In a few months the Sunday School

weakened and died.

For a period of about four years they had no services of any kind. Then they determined to organize again, which they did, with Mr. Heney Mitchell as leader. About this time Rev. J.C. Plexio moved to Menlo Ga. at the foot of Lookout Mt.

Early in the spring of 1931 Mr Plexico met a stranger on the street of Menlo who asked him where he could get a Bible. "This was the beginning of Cloudland Presbyterian church.

It has always been thought by Mr Plexico that this stranger was sent to speak to hime by the spirit as much as Phillip was sent to speak to the Eunock.

Mr Mitchell (the stærnger) envited the preacher up to speak

to them. The preacher accepted and preached at the old school house for about a year, every second and fourth Sunday afternoon ..

The spiritual out-look was very encouraging on the mountain, when a stranger appeared one day at the Manse and told Mr. Plexico that if he "ould hands off", the work, that he would nuild what the people needed through the influence of some rich friends.

Of course the preacher felt that we would have room for only one church, and willingly gave the work to the Methodist and

Baptist, who were in the majority in that community.

Winter came, then summer, and still no church was strted, The Sunday School had died again, when again the call came to Mr Plexico to return and take up the work where he had left off.

This he did with the help of his wife they organized a S.S. two miles up the mountain and one two miles down the mountain. This idea was to erect a building at Cloudland and combine the two Sunday Schools.

Before the preacher started the great task, of raising the money for the building, he ahnounced feom the pulpit at Menlo just what his plans were and that if the other denominations wanted the work he would gladly give way since field needed only one church and this, only with the understanding that they would give the people thetr some servive ever Sunday.

At the close of the service a Baptist gave the first \$1.00 toward the building.

At the Fall meeting od Cherokee Presbytery 1933, Mr Plexico met with the Synod's work committee and requested a Field worker for at least part time. This was granted, and shortly afterwards

Miss Hudson immediatly won the love and confidence of the people and has done a wonderful work which cannot be valued in

At the chose of the Seminary at Decatur, in 1934, we secured the services of Mr.C.G.Pepper, a young student, who lived and worked with the people through the summer doing a fine work.

A Commission was appointed at the Fall meeting od Presbytery to organize a church at Cloudland. which was done on Sunday afternoon, September 23.1934, with twenty-four charter members.

Since the organization over a year ago, we have an enrollment of about sixty in Sunday School, and a thriving Young Peoples organization witha membership of forty.

Mr Plexico sent out more than a thousand letters to church members through-out the Presbytery, asking for donations and gifts toward building and furnishing the church. The Lord certainly blessed the work, for at the time that the corner stone was laid they had received \$ 1.036.41, and in labor \$433.11. with \$ about \$500.00 to go before they could feel that the work was accomplished.

A copy of the leaflet with the names of those who donated to the work was placed behind the cornerstone.

Work was really begun on the building in 1934, Corner stone laid in spring of 1935. and the church was dedicated August 30.1936. and will always be a memorial to the untireing efforts of Rev.J.C. Plexico and to Miss Pearl Hudson. Rev.Cecil Thompson was pastor at the time of dedication. Mr Plexico having decided to golinto the Evangelistic work, and located at Marietta Ga.

The outside walls as well as the interior of church are made of native stone. The floor is of flagstone and the pulpit is built of the native stone.

Although not completed, the building is being used for the purpose intended each Sabbath, and we thank our Heavenly Father every day for thefriends who, through gifts of money and furnishings and labor have made it possible to have such a lovely building to worship in.

At this time, March 1940, Rev. David Boozer is pastor of the church. coming to us in the fall of 1938.

The ladies first orgaized a Circle among the members to be a unit of the Mendo Auxiliary.later, as the interest increased, and membership grew, we organized a Auxiliary in 1939. with the help of the Menlo Auxiliary, and under the direction of District Chairman, Miss Myrtle Jennings. Mrs. Amos Green was elected the first president. with a full corp of officers. and we sent our first report to Cherokee Presbyterial Meeting in Marietta in April 1939.

Cloudland Presbyterian Church Cloudland, Georgia I940-194I The Auxiliary-The Cloudland Auxiliary had its regular twelve meetings of the year and had special offerings and study books. They helped send our delegates to the Pioneer and Young Peoples Conferences at Darlington last June. The Ladies that could helped in the Daily Vacation Bible School last May under the direction of Rev. D. E. Boozer. Doubled the White Cross package and sent a bundle to Thornwell last fall with the Chattagoo Presbytery. The Church-The Church has had a veryb successful year. Really the best in its history. We had a very fine meeting last September with the Rev. J. G. Kirchoff of Summerville. We had nine (9) to join by Profession of Faith. HISTORY OF CLOUDLAND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH 1942-1943

This church was without a pastor until June of this church year, when Elmer R. Enlow, Jr. came to the field. The Woman's Auxiliary deemed it best to disband, because of the small number of members and their distance from the church and from one another. The women voted instead to put all their efforts into promoting the Young People's Society. Sunday School and Young People's Society met each Sunday, the attendance being fair. Preaching services were held twice a month after the arrival of the pastor. A good Vacation Church School was held, the average attendance being 35. A week of special services was conducted by the pastor in September. Attendance and interest were fair, though there were no conversions or additions to the church. The benevolent offerings of the church amounted to \$50. The church membership at the end of the year remained at 35.
