A petition was presented to the Presbytery of Athens for the organization of a Presbyterian Church at Comer, Georgia, during the fall meeting in 1893. The petition was granted and a Committee was appointed for that purpose. On October 28th, 1893, Rev. Henry Newton, R.C. Latimer, and Thomas N. Long organized the Comer Presbyterian Church, in the house of worship belonging to the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, in Comer.

There were ten charter members.

In the early morning hours of March 22, 1932, a fearful cyclone struck the town of Comer and ruined many houses, among them the beloved little Church. It was wrecked beyond repair. The membership was sad and almost heartbroken and thought it would be impossible for them ever to build again; but God in His love and mercy, put it into one man's heart (though he was not a member of any church) to say he would give one hundred dollars to help rebuild. That inspired the members and they planned to undertake to build.

The Committee met April 20th, and plans for building decided upon. Dr. Ralph Gillam came to help, and friends from other churches in the Presbytery joined in helping. On October 2nd, 1932, at 8 P.M., the Church was dedicated to God's service.

We are so thankful to God for His making it possible for us to rebuild, because we now have a much larger and nicer Church than before.

# HISTORY OF THE COMER PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH COMER, GEORGIA ATHENS PRESBYTERY

A Petition was presented to the Presbytery of Athens, during its fall meeting in 1893 for the organization of a Church at Comer, Ga. The Petition was granted and a committee was appointed for that purpose.

On Oct. 28th 1893, Rev. Henry Newton, R.C.Lattimore and Thomas W. Long organized the Comer Church, in the House of Worship of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Comer. It was composed of the following members:

Immediately after organization, the Church met and chose for the name "The Comer Presbyterian Church". Ephriam Thompson and Andrew Jackson Thompson were then elected Ruling Elders, as they had held that office in the New Hope Church. They were then installed. Jacob Thomas Patten and George A. Key were then elected Deacons, and were at once ordained and installed as such.

Original Church Building was erected in 1897. All services were conducted here until the year 1932, when it was totally destroyed by a Tornado which struck this part of the State causing serious loss of life and property. A remarkable achievement was accomplished at this time in that the entire membership immediately succeeded in securing and giving, services and finances enabling the erection within the same year of a brick Church on the same plot of land, located on Church St., Comer, Georgia.

The rebuilding of the Church, at a time when cotton was around five cants a pound, and many members and friends had suffered severe financial losses appeared impossible. Notwithstanding this the congregation, knowing that their is nothing impossible with God, started the task. On Oct. 2, the new Church was dedicated, complete in every detail and every dollar paid. The dedication sermon was preached by Dr. C.I. Stacy, who was then acting as supply minister. The dedication prayer was offered by Dr.E.L.Hill, Pastor of Athens First Church. Rev. J.A. Simpson, Supt. of Home Missions for Athens Presbytery brought the greetings and felicitations of the Presbytery on the completion of what seemed to human minds an impossible task.

Sunday School was organized in 1900, and has continued in existence since that time. Present Supt. is T.W.Hinton.

The first wedding to be held in the Church was that of Ellen Elizabeth Griffeth to G. Franklyn Fischer of Brooklyn, N.Y. on May 14, 1933.

One month later, June 15, the marriage of Caroline Stacy to Winchester Coker of Ashland, Ga. was performed by Dr. C.I. Stacy, the father of the bride.

Deaths:

Miss E Emma Groves, daughter of Steven Cicero and Mary Strickland Groves died Feb 24, 1952 at the advanced age of 91. Funeral services were held in the church, conducted by Rev E L Hill D D with burial in the New Hope Cemetery. Miss Groves was a charter member of the church coming by letter from the New Hope Presbyterian Church in 1893. She was a faithful and loyal member of the church attending all services unless prevented by illness.

Mr William Cicero Groves, son of Steven Cicero and Mary Strickland Groves, died May 6, 1953. Funeral services conducted by Rev E L Hill D D were held in the church on May 8 with burial in the Comer Cemetery. Mr Groves served the church as an elder.

On graduating from Columbia Seminary in June 1953 Mr Ernest E Gilmore, who had served the Madison Group of Presbyterian Churches as student supply, accepted a call to these four churches and was ordained and installed in the Danielsville Presbyterian Church on July 26, 1953. The following commission was appointed by Athens Presbytery: To preach the sermon Rev William Iverson; to preside Rev Miles C Wood; to charge the congregation Rev Robert D Alexander; to charge the pastor Rev W R Thurman; to complete the commission Elder J A Baker of Danielsville, alternate Mr Howard Long of Comer.

While the member ship of our church is small we feel that under the continued leadership of Mr Gilmore the church will move forward. Regular church services are held every first and third Sunday. On April 20, 1952 Mrs F H Frost was elected an elder. His ordination and installation followed on April 27, 1952. On July 19, 1953 the three deacons Mr W E Long, Mr Leonard Palmer and Mr W F Hix were elected to serve as elders, it having been decided to make the session the only ruling body of the church. The ordination and installation service was conducted by the pastor, Rev Ernest Gilmore.

By November 1952 the church had raised \$1500 for the purchase of new pews. The church participated in the community-wide Better Home Town Program. Miss @kkimObie Sue Smith was sent to the 1953 Senior Conference at Rabun Gap-Nacoochee although the church does not have organized work for young people.

Gilmore brought a very impressive and informative bible study. A series of prayers for the New Year were had. Plans were made for work in 54. All expressed determination in going forward regardless of small numbers.

February: Comer Presbyterians met for all day meeting with other Madison County Presbyterians. An afternoon study session was held for the different age groups. September- No meeting.

October- The Presbyterian Women of Madison County met at the Comer Church for a joint meeting. Each church was well represented. It was voted to make this a quarterly affair. The January meeting was to be at Mt. Hermon Church at Ila, Ga.

Mrs. Hutchins, our Presbyterial president, was present and gave a message in her own charming manner.

Mrs. Scrutchin of the Athens First Church gave the "set-up" of the Women of the Church programs, using a chart to emphasize the various phases of the work. Mrs. G. S. Garrison of Central Church of Athens told of her work as treasurer of the Athens Presbyterial.

Mrs. Hutchins discussed the projects of the Presbyterial for the year.

It was felt that this meeting was a definite step in uniting the churches toward a common goal and of increasing fellowship among all Presbyterian women.

November- The president, Mrs. Long, appointed the nominating committee to secure officers for 1956. Mrs. Turner was asked to prepare a special program by the Sunday School to present Thornwell Orphanage.

December- Officers for 1956 were presented and approved by the Women of the Church.

Plans for submitting annual report were made, also our budget system.

Programs on Stewardship and The Joy Gift were presented by Mrs. Smith and Mrs. Turner.

January 1, 1958 - December 31, 1959

The first Sunday in November 1957, I preached at the Comer Presbyterian Church as a student (middler) from Columbia Theological Seminary, Decatur, Georgia. The congregation then asked that I continue as student supply for the remainder of the school year, preaching two Sundays a month at the Comer Church. We had Sunday School each Sunday morning at Comer Church, and Church services the first and third Sundays at 11:00 A.M. and at 7:00 P.M.

Just before Christmas a new carpet was put down in the sanctuary, which added to the comfort and beauty of the Church, and the interior of the Church was painted.

Soon after the beginning of the new year -- 1958, we organized a choir. Our choir rehearsed on Sunday evenings before the service.

On February 16th the Reverend E Sidney Anderson, Professor from Columbia Theological Seminary, administered the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

We celebrated Easter Sunday, April 6th, with special choir music and a special worship service which was more liturgical than usual.

About this time the congregation asked me to continue with them through the summer. I was very glad for the opportunity to continue working with such a fine group of Christians. During the summer I preached a series of sermons on the Ten Commandments. The members of the Comer Church joined with the New Hope Church for Wednesday evening prayer meetings at the New Hope Church.

The Reverend Samuel Inman, New Executive secretary of Athens Presbytery, administered the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper in August 1958.

Women of the Church Athens Presbytery Church History Comer Presbyterian Church Page 2 In the fall the congregation requested that I remain as student supply while completing my final year in seminary. About this time different ones began to discuss the possibility of extending me a permanent call. A new roof was put on the Church before cold weather set in. At the stated winter meeting of Athens Presbytery the officers of the Comer and New Hope Churches were advised by the Church Extension Committee that together they would be provided with the necessary additional funds to call an ordained minister. Congregational meetings were held in both Churches. They extended me a call, subject to approval by Athens Presbytery. I gladly accepted the call. On June 14, 1959, I was ordained and installed as pastor of the New Hope and Comer Churches by a commission of Athens Presbytery. This is the first time in several years that either of these Churches have had an ordained minister. Through the summer we had a series of sermons from St. Paul's Epistle to the Romans. The first week in November we had services each night with the Reverend Robert Dobbins, pastor of the First Church in Elberton, as guest preacher. These services were very well attended, and we felt that they were a source of uplift and inspiration for the entire community. During the entire year, the different Cause Secretaries performed their task as best they could. Mrs. A. J. Griffeth was in charge of the clothes for Over-Seas Relief, sponsored by Church World Service and she mailed a package of clothes in August, 1958.

Our entire Church and Community were saddened when Mrs. F. H. Frost told us in January 1959 she had definitely decided to move to Columbus, Georgia. She felt it best that she not stay alone in Comer. We were happy tho when she said she would remain a member of our Church and continue to support it and the W.O.C.

On March 15, 1959 the Chapel Choir, Columbia Theological Seminary, Decatur, Georgia charmed listners who had gathered at Comer Methodist Church for the occasion. Our own Lowell Sykes, Student Pastor of Comer-New Hope Churches, was the director. After the program, the ladies of the two Churches served refreshments to the Group in the Church Annex.

At the April 1959 Meeting of the W.O.C. the ladies "adopted" one of the ladies at Quitman Presbyterian Home, hoping to add a little cheer to her by remembering her with cards, letters and gifts through the year. Our "adopted" one is a member of the Presbyterian Church and a very lovely person.

The W.O.C. were instrumental in getting Miss Martha Little, a missionary on furlough from Brazil, to come to our Church June 3, 1959 for a fellowship hour and a message of her work in Brazil.

Oh June 14, 1959 Ordination Services for Lowell Sykes were held at New Hope Church. Rev. Sykes had accepted the pastoral office in the Comer-New Hope churches. After the Ordination Services, the entire congregation was invited to the Educational Building, where a delicious picnic supper was served by the ladies of the two Churches. Each member rejoiced at having an ordained minister to lead us once again and to have such a fine person as Lowell Sykes. He and his wife will occupy the home of Mrs. F. H. Frost, who recently moved to Columbus, Georgia.

Church History Comer Presbyterian Church Page 4 At the July meeting the ladies of New Hope and Comer Churches surprised our pastor and his wife, Rev. & Mrs. Sykes, with a miscellaneous shower. On August 20, 1959, Obe Sue Smith, daughter of Mr. & Mrs. J. O. Smith, and Charles Snelling were united in marriage and on September 3, 1959 the ladies of the Church honored them with a shower at the attractive home of Mrs. Sykes. Each night during the revival at the Comer Presbyterian Church, November 1 - 5, the visiting pastor, Rev. Robert Dobbins of the First Presbyterian Church, Elberton, Georgia, with Rev. & Mrs. Sykes, were entertained in homes of the W.O.C. There were no new members added to the Church but all received a spiritual blessing. During the year 1958 our total gifts amounted to \$137.00 and for 1959 total gifts amounted to \$74.60. We sent \$10.00, 1959 Birthday Offering to go to the Presbyterian Missions in Brazil. \$17.00 to Thornwell Orphanage; \$15.00 to Rabun Gap School; \$15.00 Joy Gift. In 1958 we sent \$3.00 to White Cross and in 1959 our Society furnished our quota of 4 large towels and 20 large bath cloths. We only had one member to attend Athens Presbyterial 1959, which was held at Cornelia Presbyterian Church. In conslusion, we feel we have accomplished very little the past two years, however, considering the fact that we are so small in number, about 8 active members, and being without a regular pastor until June 1959, it might be said that we perhaps accomplished more than we thought, considering the circumstances.
