### HISTORY OF THE DANIELSVILLE CHURCH

A glimpse into the early days of the Danielsville Church is given to us from
the pen of the Rev. Groves H. Cartledge, in his original manuscript of,
now
"The History of Hebron Church". In speaking of the two/extinct churches
of Concord and Pisgah, Dr. Cartledge brings Danielsville into the story in
the following way: "This Pisgah Church, south of Danielsville, about a mile or
two, had been organized out of a portion of New Hopes members by their pastor,
Rev. William Montgomery in 1089 or 1810, and was by him reported to the Presbytery at its meeting in Sandy Creek (Bethsaida) in September 1910, and William
Hodge took a seat in Presbytery at the same time from the church of Pisgah.
Alexander Thompson, Jr., was an Elder in the same church."

According to the same writer, members from the now extinct church of Concord, located about 6 miles northeast of the town of Danielsville became members of this church when it ceased to exist. Dr. Cartledge also says that "The Pisgah church was afterwards removed to the village of Danielsville in 1821, and is now the Danielsville Church."

The names of both Danielsville and Pisgah appears in the minutes of Presbytery for a year or so. Danielsville is first mentioned in the minutes of Hopewell Presbytery in 1820 (April) page 178, Vol I. At that time 15 members were reported. William Hodge is also mentioned as an Elder representing the Church of Danielsville in 1826. This could be the same Elder mentioned from Pisgah in the above story.

History of the Danielsville Presbyterian Church Danielsville, Georgia

The Danielsville Church is a wooden structure measuring about 40 by 60 feet, and was erected about 1889. Two years ago it was repaired and remodeled by Dr. Ralph Gillam efforts, with the help of contributions from others in the Presbytery. I have not been able to get even a kodak picture of this newer building. No definite record of the organization of this church is available. Danielsville is located about sixteen miles from Athens, Georgia.

Soon after the Revolutionary War, Samuel Long, the head of a Presbyterian Colony came to Georgia from Carlisle, Pennsylvania, and settled in what is known as the Paoli Community. His son, James Long, and father of Crawford W. Long, acknowledged discoverer of Ether Anaesthesia, established himself at Denielsville, and was living there when Madison County and the town was established. He was the first Clerk of the Superior Court, was designated by act of Legislature, establishing the Madison County Acasemy, as one of the first Trustees. It is presumed that he, with other members of the Colony which came from Pennsylvania, established the Church. The first record is from data from General Assembly. It was already established and functioning in 1826, with 27 members.

No name of pastor is given until 1829-1833, which was Professor Alonzo Church of the University of Georgia, at Athens. He was at that time President of the University. He served the longest time as President, 1829-1859, of any other President before or since. That was before the office of Chancellor was created, but the duties then were the same as Chancellor now. In 1834 John Harrison was pastor.

The Longs, father and mother of Dr. Crawford W. Long, are buried here. Others are Colberts, Daniels, Sanders, Scotts, Meadows, Bullocks, Bakers, Moseleys, Griffeths, and others.

Only one minister, as far as is known, has gone out from this Church. He was Rev. R.T. Baker.

An autstanding event, was a "Revival" in 1886, with members added to the Church. The church building was built principally by these members. Rev. Groves H. Cartlegge, respected and loved, supplied the church at intervals from 1880 to his death. His son, Dr. S.J. Cartledge began his ministry here.

Preaching services are held at 11:00 a.m. on the first Sunday of each month, with the Rev. Richard T. Baker as interim supply. The church has given \$500 to benevolences, plys a gift of \$500 to the Halt Hunger Campaign on Worldwide Communion Sunday. In addition to these gifts, individual members have sent several hundred dollards to particular causes such as individual churches within the denomination adn to independent causes (World Vision and others). Property improvements made by the church were a new roof for the church building, asphalt pavement for the church parking area, ferns for the sanctuary, a new pulpit Bible, and re-varnishing for the sanctuary pews. A new altar rail curtain and carpet runners for the aisles and entrance were donated by one of the women of the church. On June 15 Miss Ann Baker, a member of this church, became the bride of Mr. George A. Doxey, Jr., of Wheaton, Illinois, in a church wedding ceremony. This was the first wedding held in the church in recent years. The service was unusual in its symbolic candle-lighting service and in the evangelistic appeal made by the officiating minister, Rev. Albert W. Martin of Caldwell, New Jersey. Mr. and Mrs. Doxey are living in Philadelphia where Mr. Doxey is attending Westminster Theological Seminary. J. A.
