History of the Women of the Church, 1961 - 1962.

Dawes Presbyterian Church.

An organization of the women, with varying degrees of success and failure, had existed at Dawes for the most part of the twenty years of its existence as a Chapel of the First Presbyterian Church of Thomasville, Georgia. But the unanimous vote to organize the Chapel into a Church seemed to revitalize the ladies and they met on the night of December 5, 1961, to perfect an organization to be known as The Women of the Church. The following officers were elected: President, Mrs. Talmadge Ferguson, Vice President, Mrs. Robert Turq, Secretary, Mrs. James Fain, Treas. Mrs. L. W. Royal.

Ten meetings have been held since the organization, with good attendance. The meetings were held on the first Tuesday night of each month. The Bible lessons have been taught and a fter the program and

business session, a social hour has been enjoyed.

Among the projects sponsored by the women have been:

Curtains for the Sunday School rooms.

A lovely Communion table for the Church, the women paying for the material and Mr. and Mrs. Shedd giving their work. Material for the new fommunion cloths was donated by Mrs. E.A.Dawes and Mrs. Robert Shedd and Mrs. James Sculley made them up.

Money was raised by free will offerings for a new pump and the digging of a deep well as there was no water available on the grounds. A telephone was installed for the pastor, monthly payments to be kept

up by the women.

A most successful Bible School was held in June with the following women serving as teachers: Beginners, Mrs. Harold Butler and Mrs. Parks Weaver, Primaries, Mrs. Talmadge Ferguson and Mrs. James Fain, Juniors, Mrs. Robert Turq. Other women served refreshments at noon each day. About 45 were enrolled.

Six of the ladies attended District Conference at Climax.

The offerings for the year amounted to \$113.00 for Benevolences and \$395.46 for Current Expenses. Total, \$508.46.

Officers for the coming year: President, Mrs. Talmadge Ferguson, Vice presidents, Mrs. Robert Turq and Mrs. Robert Shedd, Secretary, Mrs. Marold Butler, Treasurer, Mrs. L.W. Royal. Cause Chairmen to be appointed.

With the organization of the Chapel in to a Church on February 11, 1961 and the arrival of the young pastor, Rev. Marold Adkins, a new era has dawned and we feel sure the omen of the Church will play a large part in the future service and success of the Dawes Presbyterian Church.

In the first full year of service in the newly organized Dawes Church the women have aided and sponsored many useful projects. There were 12 meetings held, with an average attendance of 10, three having a perfect record. The enrollment is twenty-two. The Circle Bible Study was given each month by the women in turn and the Church Causes were presented. A pleasant social hour followed each meeting, with refreshments. Two special speakers were heard during the year. Mrs. B.G.Munro spoke on the Work of the Women at the various Assembly Levels. Mr. Robert Shedd dicussed Women as Officers in the Church. Seven women attended the District Conference in Cairo. They were: Mesdames Ferguson, Turq, Butler, Yarbrough, Robert Shedd, John Shedd and Wallace. At Easter, an Egg Hunt was given for the children and in August a Church Family Dinner was held after the morning worship. A Vacation Bible School was conducted by the women in June, with an average attendance of thirtyethree. Those teaching were: Beginners, Mrs. Parks Weaver and Mrs. Harold Butler. Primaries, Mrs. Jack Smith and Mrs. James Sculley. Juniors, Mrs. Robert Turq. Young People, Rev. Harold Adkins. The Whie Cross quota was met in full. Projects sponsored by the women included the painting of the interior of the church, sanding and painting the flaors and a beautiful new carpet. The pastor's telephone was also paid for by them. Two generous gifts have added much to the comfort and beauty of the church: Air Conditioning of the sanctuary by Mrs. Ed Dawes and ten levely Azaleas by Pete Wills. The Treasurer reported gifts as follows: Benevolences, \$94.71 and Current Expenses, \$275.49, Total, \$370.20. Officers for the coming year are: President, Mrs. Blanche Wright. Vice presidents, Mrs. Parks Weaver and Mrs. James Sculley. Secretary, Mrs. Harold Butler. Treasurer, Mrs. L.W. Royal. Historian, Mrs. Robert Wallace. Chairmen: Spiritual Growth, Mrs. Lark Sculley. Chrisitan Education, Mrs. Jack Smith. Stewardship, Mrs. Everette Causey. Church Extension, Mrs. L.W. Royal. World Missions, Mrs. James Fain. Annuities and Relief, Miss Shirley Yarbrough. General Fund, Mrs. J.C. Wills. The addition of a handsome new Bulletin Board on the Church lawn has added greatly to the property and now the little church is a thing of beauty within and without and a joy to the hearts of the loyal members. mis. 189801 History of Dawes Presbyterian Church

In July of 1940, a new out-station was organized in a community on the Albany Road. Mrs. Shelby Pope has been Chairman of the Circle with Mrs. R.P. Wimberly Sr. as her co-worker. The Circle meets on fourth Mondays and has an average attendence of ten with a nucleus of eighteen or twenty.

A new Sunday School was organized on the Albany Road with Mr. Leroy

Edwards as Superintendent, with an average attendence of twenty five. The School

was opened in July and is making good progress.

Dawes Memorial Chapel was built by Mr. W.A. Dawes and Mr. E.A. Dawes in memory of their wife and mother, Mrs. Lillie Craft Dawes. Mrs. Dawes had more than once in her lifetime expressed a desire that the community would at sometime in the future be served by our Church. This beautiful Chapel was dedicated December 29, 1940. Much of the labor for the building was contributed by the men of the community.

Mr Roy Edwards is Superintendent of the Sunday School and Rev. R.T. Gillespie preaches at the Chapel every Sunday Morning.

Beginning the Church Year April 1, 1940, Dawes had twelve members on Profession of Faith and nine by Statment or Letter. Revival services were held at Dawes during the year. Membership from April 1, 1939 to April 1, 1940 was as follows:

Sunday School Superintendent is Boone Leach with the following teachers: Mrs. Boone Leach, Miss Billie Powell and Mrs. J.W. Mitchell. Mrs. Mitchell has been a teacher since 1945. The Sunday School sponsored a Daily Vacation Bible School from June 13 - 18. The Young People's Work was organized by Miss Margaret

Mitchell in L941.

The Women of the Church are a Circle of the First Church. Mrs. Shelby Pope has been Chairman for a number of years and her position is now being filled by Mrs. Doctor Mary Erickson Ferguson and Mrs Ralph McChesney. Treasurer is Miss Josie Heald. Meetings were held each month except January and February. An all day meeting was held July 17, with dinner on the ground. Rev. John A. Haley, Summer Student Pastor of First Church, conducted a Revival August 21-26.

A new piano was given the Chapel for use in the Sunday School rooms by

Mrs E.A. Dawes. During the summer Mr. E.A. Dawes re-stuccoed the exterior of

the Chapel and re-decorated the interior, which was greatly appreciated by all.

Rev. James B. Spencer arrived August 1, to assume duties as Pastor of Dawes Chapel and Dillon. Dismissed to Bosyon Presbyterian Church were Mrs. Madge Heald and children, William, Emory, Russell, Eugene and Norma Jean. Rev. Spencer was married to Miss Duchess Williams of Thomasville, Georgia and resigned to accept a position in Macon, Georgia.

In June 1959, Rev. Charles M. Efird assumed duties as Pastor of Dawes. He served through the summer of 1961, when he accepted a call to the Church at

Harrisburg, North Carolina. THe Pulpit was filled for the next few months by various ministers in the Presbytery and by Rev. R.T. Wallace, retired Minister of Thomasville, Georgia. Rev. Wallace served Conyinuously from February 1962 until June 1962. Rev. Wallace worked tirelessly with the members in trying to establish Dawes Chapel into a church of its own. With the help of the Lord, this dream was realized as on February 11, 1962, Dawes Chapel became Dawes Church.

At 4:00 P.M. February 11, 1962, Dawes Chapel was Organized into Dawes Presbyterian Church by a Commission representing Southwest Georgia Presbytery. The Commission consisted of Rev. B.G. Munro of Thomasville, Chairman, with Rev. T.L. Illewelyn, Boston, REv. Marshall Smith, Quitman, Elder W.J. Powell, Thomasville and Elder Roy Hallman of Boston.

Special music was provided by Mrs. Mildred Wise, pianist and Garol Rolt, soloist. Old members of Dawes Chapel and those coming by Letter signified their acceptance of the Organizing Covenant by a show of hands which was unanimous for those present. The Congregation nominated and elected as Elders, Robert Shedd and E.T. Ferguson. The Congregation also nominated and elected as Deacons, James Sculley, L.W. Royal, Robert Turq and James Smith. After answering questions put to them by the Gommission, the Elders and Deacons were installed by the Laying On Of Hands, by the Commission with assent from the Congregation.

Rev. Adkins was duly accepted and approved by Presbytery and was duly ordained and installed as minister of Dawes Presbyterian Church on August 5, 1962. Additional books were given by friends and members with the Sunday School purchasing one book a month.

We are very grateful to First Presbyterian Church of Moultrie, Georgia for the gift of a set of hymnbooks and a Communion Set.

The Women of the Church sponsored a project of Church improvments. In -

cluded in these were : The drilling of a well and the installation of a pump.

The men of the Church graciously installed water pipes over the entire grounds.

A complete paint job was done on the inside of the Church along with a complete refinishing job on the floors. Carpet was installed down the center aisle and on the pulpit. A new Communion Table was given by the Women of the Church and this was made by Mr. and Mrs. Robert Shedd.

The Young People cleaned the grounds and planted azaleas and boxwoods that were given by Gordon W. Wills. Mr. and Mrs. Robert Shedd made and gave a handsome new bulletin board which was installed on the front lawn. They also gave new bulletin boards for the Sunday School rooms. The Young People also gave a new bookcase to the Church.

The men doing the work themselves, scraped and repainted the entire outside of the Church. Mrs. E.A.Dawes gave the Church a new air conditioning system.

The Women of the Church together with the Pastor have sucessfully organized and carried on a Daily Vacation Bible School in 1963 and 1964.

There was an average attendence of 38 children and 8 teachers.
