THE ELMODEL PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH
ELMODEL, GEORGIA
1903-1947

On the first Sunday afternoon in May 1903, under the spreading oak trees on the West banks of the Chickasamhatchee Creek at Elmodel, Ga., the first seed were planted which was later to grow into a Presbyterian Church.

Rev. Archie McLaughlin, who was paster of the Presbyterian Churches at Newton and Camilla, Ga., conducted the service, preaching to about twenty white people who were sitting on very crude benches. One of the things of this service which impressed Mr. McLaughlin, was, that he preached to more negroes, who were sitting on the ground near by, than he did to white people.

There were seven Presbyterian present at this service and they decided to invite Rev. Mr. Mc-Laughlin to come to Elmodel once a month and preach in the afternoon on the Sunday when he preached in Newton. Mr. McLaughlin accepted and he later gave us one Sunday each month in addition to afternoon Service.

a brush arbor was constructed near the spot where this first service was held and we had services under this arbor through the summer of 1903 and until the weather got codd, when we transferred to the school building where we held service through the winter months.

In the early spring of 1904, a fr me structure merely a frame, made of rough timber, covered with boards, no end or side walls whatsoever, and no floors, other than the fround, was constructed and this building affectionately dedicated, "The Tabernacle" was used that summer. The congregations were small, with only nine Presbyterian in regular attendance, yet we feel that we received some of our greatest spiritual blessings while we were worshiping in The Tabernacle.

Rev. W.H. Zeigler, Albany, Ga., and Mr. John O. Perry, and Elder from the Newton Church. Mr. Thomas E. Plowden was a visiting Elder from the Dickey hurch.

Presbyterian Church and Women of the Church Elmodel, Georgia 1949 - 1950 This church has been without a pastor for more than four years, therefore we have made very little progress. However, we have kept the Sunday School going with an average attendance of about twentyfive (25). For a number of years our Sunday School has sent a special Thanks-giving offering to Thornwell Orphanage, Clinton, S. C. We always have a Christmas tree, with program, an Easter egg hunt on Saturday afternoon, with Easter program Sunday morning, and a Fourth of July picnic for our children. We haven't had any new equipment for our church or Sunday School in a long time. Our church is small, with only two class rooms. We hope some day, in the not too far distant future, to have a new church building with more class rooms. No children have been baptized and none have recited catechism. We hope to get some to recite catechism this year. George L. Davis, Supt., with four teachers. Our church is in a rural community and children from other denominations help to make our attendance what it is. George -. Davis, an Elder, is the only officer in our church. We do not have an auxiliary. Four members have been dismissed by letter - they are: Mrs. Nee; Miss Mary Ann Adkins; Mr. N. D. McRainey, an Elder; Mrs. N. D. McRainey, and Gay McRainey. Rev. N. H. Williams, a retired Methodist minister who lives at Camilla, preached for us a few times in 1948. Rev. Tom Dews of Rood Park, Henderson Chapels, Albany, preached once in July, 1948. Rev. E. L. Barber, Executive Secretary Presbytery of Southwest Georgia, came to us in the early summer of 1948, and had a service immediately after Sunday School. No one knew he was coming. Mr. Barber continued to preach for us at irregular intervals or, when his other work would permit him to come, until December, 1949. In July, 1948, we had a bible school conducted by Tr. Barber and Miss Ann Fleming, assisted by ladies of the community. Mr. Barber also preached at night the week of the bible school, and one new member, Mr. P. J. Godfrey, was received into the church. Mr. L. V. Secrest who will graduate from Columbia Seminary in May, has accepted the call to be pastor of the Camilla, Pelham and Elmodel churches, preaching at Elmodel in the afternoon on the first and third Sabbaths in each month. Mr. Secrest preached his first sermon at Elmodel on January 29, 1950.

Our present Pastor, Rev. L. V. Secrest, was installed Pastor and Charged by Presbyer's Commission, Rev. E.L. Barber- September 27, 1950. Rev. William McKay preached the sermon and Elder L.W. Gratz- Dawson, gave the chargeto the Congregation.

Mr. George L. Davis serves as Deacon and Elder. Mr Davis was installed Deacon in August 1915 and installed Elder April 6, 1924.

Although our Church was organized in 1904, we had our first funeral service, Mr. Grover C. Brooks, November 150; and a few weeks later a funeral service for Little Wanda Swann.

The first Church Wedding was Miss Martha Ivy Adkins and Mr. Calvin E. Touchston- June 16, 1951.

The Church was painted inside and out; however, there was no equipment of any type purchased. We are in hopes
of building a new church in the not too far distant future. The
Synod of Georgia recently donated \$1000.00 to our Church building
fund. Our Church is one of the Home Mission Churches.

Of the fourteen Charter Members, so far as there is known there are only two living: Mr. Geo. L. Davis and Miss Florence Davis.

Scruggs assisted by Mrs. Scruggs held a sunrise Easter service on the banks of the Chickasawhatchee creek near the home of Mr. and Mrs. Keith Kidd, Elmodel, Georgia, April 18, 1954.

Elmodel Presbyterian Church Jan. 1, 1954 - Jan. 1, 1955 On October 12, 1954 an all-day meeting on evangelism was held at the historic Dickey Presbyterian Church, Dickey, Georgia. At this meeting, Elmodel representatives included Rev. J. E. Scruggs, pastor, Mr. George L. Davis, elder, and Miss Florence Davis. Our Sunday School has special programs at Easter, Mother's Day, Father's Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas. We always send our special Thanksgiving offering to Thornwell Orphanage, Clinton, South Carolina. The last week in October we had revival services with Rev. Scruggs doing the preaching at night only. Mrs. Scruggs had a Bible story hour preceding the worship service. This hour was supposed to be for the youth of the church but older people attended each service. At this time seven members were received into the church. The following six members came by letter from other churches, Mrs. Blanche Hay, Mrs. Roy M. Brooks, Mr. Alma Hay, Mrs. Alma Hay, Miss Sylvia Anne Hay and Arbut Hay. Miss Anne Musgrove on confession of faith and was baptized. The above seven members were received into the Elmodel Presbyterian Church on October 31, 1954, the fiftieth anniversary of the organization of the church. 




