"Eighty-five per cent of the members of the First
Presbyterian Church live within one mile of the Church,
with the remaining 15% being divided into 10% from one
to three miles. Although present facilities for the
Church School are inadequate, the City of Thomasville
is not growing fast enough to warrant immediate colonization. It will be wise business strategy, however, to
purchase property in the North-eastern sector of the
city immediately, and then make long-range plans for
a new church at the propitious time in the future."

From History of the First Presbyterian Church, February, 1965:
"Plans are being made for the new church. Committees were appointed as follows:

The Worship Service and Church School.

Pulpit Supply.

Building Plans.

Elder Randolph Malone is General Chairman of this New Church Committee."

"The first services of the 'New Church' were held at the Jerger School, South Broad Street, (Feb. 28, '65). Sunday School at 9:45 AM and Worship Service, 11 AM."

June, 1965:

"Progress has continued on the new church. The members have voted to call themselves 'Friendship Presbyterian Church.' Mr. Richard Austin, who is a Senior at Columbia Theological Seminary was called as Pastor. Mr. Austin graduates from the Seminary this June."

October, 1965:

"The Congregation was given the opportunity to make special gifts to the Friendship Church at the morning service, October 17th."

May, 1966:

"The organizational service for the Friendship Presbyterian Church was held May 29th. A special Commission from Southwest Georgia Presbytery handled the service. This was a culmination of a dream our Church has had for some years. We feel that with this additional church the Presbyterians in our community will be better ministered to, and even more important, we Presbyterians can do a better job of serving this community."

April 28, 1965:

"The Clerk was asked to present and emphasize to the congregation, at a morning service, that the new church is under the sponsorship of the First Church, and that the responsibility lies with our congregation as a whole, and not alone with the few who have assumed prime responsibility in this project."

May 26, 1965:

"Dr. Malone reported on the new church, and advised that the name selected is 'Friendship Presnyterian Church;' that the attendance at Sunday services averages about 35; and that the offering is approximately \$125.00 per week. It is hoped that the architect's plans for the initial construction will be available by May 29. In accordance with the new church's recommendation, the following call was approved by the Session:

'The Session of First Presbyterian Church, Thomasville, Georgia, in Stated Meeting on May 26, 1965, requests Mr. Richard Austin to accept the position of Assistant Pastor, and offers to pay, as its part of the salary, an amount not to exceed \$3,000 annually, inclusive of all benefits. This is understood to be in co-operation with amounts paid by the Presbytery of Southwest Georgia, and the group now calling themselves "The Friendship Presbyterian Church of Thomasville, Georgia. Furthermore, the Pastor and the Clerk of the Session are fully authorized to prosecute the call through the necessary Presbytery channels; said authorization conditioned only by the foregoing motion.'

June 16, 1965:

"Regarding Friendship Presbyterian Churchm the pastor reported that plans drawn by the architect have been most favorably received, and that a copy of the plans have been sent for review by the Department of Architecture of the Board of Church Exgension."

1965 - 1966

In 1957, or even prior to that time, The First Presbyterian Church of Thomasville, Georgia had been studying the possibility and advisability of starting still another Presbyterian Church in the City. Dawes Chapel serves the area to the Northwest of the city. The Second Presbyterian Church serves the area to the South.

Following the advice of the Atlanta Office of the Board of Church Extension a four-acre tract of land located on the north side of Smith Avenue a few hundreds from and on the west side of US Highway 19 was purchased.

A survey was made by Miss Marie Gibert, and beginning August 18, 1964 talks were held which resulted in the actual volunteering of several couples to start making definite plans.

Many informal meetings were held in the different homes. Rev. B. G. Munro gave invaluable help and service. The Session of the First Church at the same time was planning how a new church could and should be begun. Consultations with Mr. Robert Jinright, Architect, were held concerning plans for a church plant, and particularly on erecting just a part of the plant that would be sufficient for the time-being for class-rooms and a Fellowship Hall. (There was no existing building obtainable in the neighborhood that would serve as temporary quarters.)

Some classrooms and the auditorium of Jerger Elementary School were made available for our use, and while these were located a considerable distance from our building site, it enabled us to make a start, and begin working together as a group.

The first worship service was held on February 28, 1965 with Rev. R. T. Wallace preaching the sermon entitled "Heavenly Love." One month later a Communion Service was conducted by Rev. Roger Gallion.

Regular services were held from the beginning with different ones bringing the messages. On May 9, 1965 Mr. Richard Austin preached for us. He was later called by the First Church to come as an assistant pastor, looking forward to his being called as the pastor of Friendship Church when it should be organized as a particular church. This call from the First Church was accepted.

On May 22, 1966 we met for worship in the Fellowship Hall of the new building on Smith Avenue.

On May 29, 1966 a Commission appointed by the Presbytery of Southwest Georgia composed of Rev. Arghie C. Smith, Executive Secretary of the Presbytery; Rev. B. G. Munro, Pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Thomasville; Rev. Albert Ray, Pastor of Second Presbyterian Church of Thomasville; Rev. R. M. Matthews, Pastor of the Presbyterian Church of Boston, Georgia; and Elders Eugene Driver and Langdon Flowers of the First Presbyterian Church met to effect the organization of Friendship Presbyterian Church. Dr. Smith presided. Mr. E. T. Ferguson, Dr. R. A. Malone, and J. F. Watt (all previously ordained) were installed as elders. Messrs. R. H. Jefferson, Jr., Joe Horne, and J. Phil Leabo were ordainedlas deacons. They with Mr. Jamie W. Oglesby (previously ordained) were installed as deacons. There were thirty-one charter members enrolled.

Rev. Richard M. Austin was installed as Pastor.

Almost from the first a kindergarten was envisaged. Mrs. Boone Leach, whose ability as a director was greatly admired, had just moved back to Thomasville, and we were able to obtain her services. Money from the sale of some prized possessions donated by Mrs. Thelma Alexander was the beginning of the Kindergarten Treasury. September, 1966 found the building being used daily for the children, who have meant much in the life of the church.

The Women-of-the-Church were organized September, 1966. Though comparatively few in number, they have been very active. Mrs. J. W. Oglesby, as the first president, gave the leadership needed.

On October 18, 1966 we were privileged and honored to have the Stated Fall Meeting of Southwest Georgia Presbytery held in our church.

During the year 1966 seven adults joined us by transfer of membership. Three babies were baptized and accepted into the Covenant Family.

Sunday School classes were using the Covenant Life Curriculum, and children, as well as adults, were feeling the joy of being a part of the Church life.

Mrs. E. R. Kellersberger, author and former missionary to the Congo, spoke to us on November 9th bringing her inimitable message of love, dedication to the Master, and a World-Wide vision.

Gifts came in that made the worship services more beautiful—an organ, two pianos, a Communion set, and Offering Plates were some of them. A stove and refrigerator for the kitchen to make it easier for entertaining. Family night suppers are held once a month.

Near the end of the year Mrs. Thelma Alexander, one our charter members, died. Her funeral was conducted in our little church.

So, the work was started.

Pastor read a paper on April 6 containing a statement of his change in beliefs and wish to dissolve his pastoral relationship as of April 27. Congregation voted to accept his resignation. The Commission on the Minister and his Work attended the congregational meetings held during the month of April. The Commission assumed leadership of the church aster that date. The congregation named an Advisory Council to be composed of the male members of the Church and Miss Sheila Massey as secretary. Many members of the Church discontinued their support when Rev. Armstrong left; the membership was reduced to approximately 30. The Advosory Council and the Commission worked diligently to form plans for the on-going of the Church. An interim pastor was found (Rev. Wm. C. Sistar, Sr.) and he began in service to the ChurchAugust 9, 1975. The Presbytery appointed an Administrative Commission to care for the affairs of the congregation composed of: Rev. Raymon L. White, Edgewood Church, Columbus, Ga. as Chairman; Rev. Wade H. Bell, Jr., pastor First Church, Valdosta, Ga.; Rev. Thomas G. Kay, Jr., pastor First Church, Albany, Ga.; Ruling Elder Roy R. Hallman, Boston Presbyterian Church; Ruling Elder Eley C. Frazer, III, Westminster Church, Albany, Ga.; Ruling Elder B.E. Lutrell, Jr., Sherwood Church, Columbus, Ga.

In cooperation with Presbytery's Administrative Commission the Advisory Council attended the local affairs of the Church; a Congregational meeting held October 19 affirmed the desire to continue as a Church with the aid and direction of the Southwest Georgia Presbytery. An adult Bible Class is conducted each Sunday by Mrs. J. Franklin Watt. The youth group was led by the Interim Ministerduring Sunday School and on Sunday afternoons.



The WOC was reorganized with remaining members in the Church. During the Advent Season the congregation placed a Christmon tree and decorated it with Christian symbols in the sanctuary. On December 21, a Vesper service of Christmas scripture, Carols, and Sonsecration was conducted by the laymen and Interim Miminster. In a report to Prebetery , there were 45 members and 12 in attendance for Sunday School as of December 31.




