

HISTORY OF THE HOSCHTON PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH
HOSCHTON, GEORGIA

At a meeting of Athens Presbytery, Synod of Georgia, meeting in Lexington April 18, 1883, the organization of this church was reported as follows:

P 22: "An application from certain persons for a church organization at Hoschton, on the G. J. and Southern Railroad was read and referred to a special committee composed of T. P. Cleveland, Rev. Milner and Elder W. W. Hubbard.

P 23. "The Committee appointed to consider the appeal of persons at Hoschton representing the organization. The following were appointed for that purpose, time to be the 4th Sunday in October and the Saturday preceding: Rev. Milner, Cleveland, Baird, Elders Knox, Turk and W. L. Espy.

p 30. R. W. Milner, Chairman of the Committee (mentioned above) reported that the church was duly organized and the name of the church enrolled, and the name of the delegate representing it. (Elder John Baird)

The following are known to have served this church as Elders:

John Baird--1883

J. V. Alexander--1888, still serving in 1903

Presbytery met in this church in September, 1888.

The church was reported vacant in 1920 and '21. No male members were reported in 1921. In 1925 only 2 members were reported. In the fall minutes of Presbytery page 7, we find the Chm of the Home Mission Committee recommending that the church be dissolved. It does not appear on the Roll of Presbytery in 1928 but nothing can be found to prove that Presbytery ever officially dissolved the church.
