55653 HISTORY OF THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH AND AUXILIARY IN PRESTON, GA. A Presbyterian Church was organized in the town of Preston, Ga., September 17, 1922. Rev. John Goff, Evangelist, was present and acted as Presbytery's representative. A church building was immediately erected in the town of Preston, county seat of Webster County, Georgia, on Cass Street. This building was dedicated in the summer of 1923. In the organization meeting, Mr. Chas. Wilson was elected Elder. and Mr. T. B. Mangham, Deacon; both men having been installed as officers in the Smyrna Presbyterian Church. In 1926 a house and lot were purchased from J. F. Sauder, to be used as a manse. The purchase price of this property was six hundred dollars, all of which was raised by public subscription. The following persons were received into the church as charter members: Mr. and Mrs. T. B. Mangham, Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Wilson, Mr. Gus Wilson, Mr. Will Wilson, Elmer Hogg, Preston Hogg, Mrs. Will Cosby, Miss Sarah Cosby, Miss Bobbie Cosby, William Cosby, Ruth Cosby, Mrs. M. A. Christian, Mr. and Mrs. T. M. Lowrey, Miss Vena Little, Mrs. Fannie Gunnels, Mr. and Mrs. E. M. McLeod, Irwin McLeod. From the organization of the Preston Church up until Jan. 1927, the following ministers served as supplies: Rev. B. H. Wiggins, Rev. J. E. Byrd, Rev. M. D. Herring, Rev. A. G. Court enay, Rev. John Goff, D.D., Rev. H. M. Smith, D.D. Rev. C. J. Matthews came to the Preston Church as stated supply, Jan. 1927 and served until June 1933. Rev. M. D. Agerton succeeded Rev. Matthews as stated supply and is still serving the church in that capacity. (1939) From 1925 until 1932 the church had a Sunday School, under the following superintendents: E. M. McLeod, C. F. In the spring of 1925 a Woman's Auxiliary of the Preston Presbyterian Church was organized with 14 members. Mrs. E. M. McLeod was elected President, and Mrs. Elliot Wilson, Secretary. In 1932, Mrs. C. J. Matthews succeeded Mrs. McLeod as President of the Auxiliary and Mrs. Elliot Wilson was re-elected Secretary.

From early 1932 until spring 1935 no meetings of the Auxiliary were held. A re-organization of the Auxiliary was effected in March 1935, with 12 members. Mrs. M. D. Agerton was elected President, Miss Polly French, Secretary, and Mrs. Chas. Wilson, Treasurer.

April 17, 1937, Mrs. A. L. Adams was elected President of the Auxiliary, Mrs. T. W. Upton, Secretary and Mrs. C. A. Wilson, Treasurer.

Since its re-organization, the Auxiliary has been very active in repairing the manse, paying taxes on church property, painting the outside of the church, and improving the interior of the church. It has always contributed as liberally as was possible to all Benevolent Causes, and has succeeded in becoming affiliated with the Fresbyterial.


