The original minute book of FRIENDSHIP BAPTIST CHURCH is beginning to show its age and is getting fragile, understandably since its first entry is 1839.

Because of this, and because of the historical importance of old church records, I decided to transcribe this minute book so the information would be available without having to refer to the original book and contribute to its destruction.

I have tried to copy the words exactly as they are spelled in the original. I also put all the names of people mentioned in capitals, which they are not in the original text, but this makes it easier to spot a name when reading. Typographical errors do occur.

FRIENDSHIP BAPTIST CHURCH is located on the north side of Highway #30 (the Friendship Road) near the intersection of Highway 153, about 13 miles west of Americus, Georgia.

Friendship Baptist Church is still an active church thought with few members. The present building which dates to the middle 1850's, is the oldest church building in Sumter County, Georgia and is an architectual gem. The cemetary is to the left of the building.

Many descendants of the early members mentioned in this minute book still live in the area and some are still members of the church. Wiley Carter, ancestor of former President Jimmy Carter was an early member of the Church and is mentioned in the minutes.

The original minute book is in the possession of Mrs Scott Hart of Schley County, Ga. Who was very generous in letting me keep the book for several weeks while I transcribed it. The original transcription was completed Friday, October 3, 1980. The index was prepared by Rev. Bill Dupree, who was pastor of First Methodist Church in Americus, Ga. at that time.

Lunsford this day met us and asisted us in the constitution on the following covanant and articles of faith on which we agred to try to keep house for the Lord first in giving our selves to the Lord and each other and we therefore aggree to try to keap up Godly deciplin meating monthly and attending to the business that may concern the Church and we further covinent and agree that we will unite effort for the furtherance of the cause of the Redeamers Kingdom on earth Tho if any of our Breathering do not feel willing to support the benevolant instatus of the day and do not interfear with our liberties in the support of the same it shall not be a breach of fellowship with us.

Articles of Faith

Held by the Baptist in jeneral agreable to the confession of faith adopted by upwards of one hundred congregations in England published in Philadepre in one thousand seven hundred and forty two which is a standard for the Baptist. 1st We believe in one only true and living God and that there are three persons in the God head the Farther son and holey Ghost.

2nd We believe the Scriptures of the old and knew testament are the word of God and the only rule of faith and practice.

3d. We believe in the doctrin of eternal and particular election.

4th. We believe in the doctrin of original Sin.

5th. We believe in mans impotancy to recover himself from the fallin State he is in by nature by his own free will and ability.

6th. We believe that siners are justifide in the sight of God only the imputed righteousness of Christ.

7th. We believe that Gods Elect shall be called regeneratic and Sanctifiede by the Holey Ghost.

8th. We believe that the saints shall perciver in grace and never finaly fall awaly.

9th. We believe that Baptisam and the Lords supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ and that true believers are the only subjects of these ordinances. We believe that the true mode of Baptisom is by immertian.

10th. We believe in the resurretian of the dead and general judgement.

11th. We believe that the punishment of the wicked will be everlasting and the Joys of the righteous will be eternal.

12th We believe that no ministers have the right to the administration of the ordinancies only such as are regurally called and come under the imposition of the hands of the Presbytery.

14th. It shall be the duty of the Decons when taking the Lords supper to notice whether any of the members are mixing with the congregation and if in case there should be any they shall report them at the next conference.

15th. It shall be the duty of the church to commune once in three month and observe washing the saints feet and days of fasting and prayre.

16th. It shall be the duty of the cleark to read the constitution and Church covnant everry communian season in the opening the conferance.

17th. The liberalities of our brethering and sisters toching the benevolent instutians of the day shall not be a breach of fellowship.

18th. It shall be the duty of the moderator to see that these rules are observed.

19th. Any amendment may be made to these rules at any time the Church may think proper.
