

December 1, 1848 - July 17, 1869



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LEBANON BAPTIST CHURCH

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The original record book is in fragile condition and, thanks to Mrs. Marion Harris, I was able to take the book and transcribe it so that it can be used without harming the original. One copy of this will be placed in the Plains Baptist Church office.

My personal interest in this early record is two-fold. First, Rev. Jesse Stallings, the first pastor, was a cousin of my great-grandmother Mary Stalling Hixon, wife of Seaborn Hixon, of Schley County, Ga. Secondly, my great-great-grandmother, Martha G. Cox, wife of Chappell Cox, became a member of Lebanon Baptist Church in 1850. Two of her daughters, Sarah Jane Cox and Martha Cox Laney became members in 1854.

After 163 years this church is still a thriving establishment.

This record was transcribed from the original April-May 2011.

Rules of Decorum

Rules of Decorum for the Government of the Lebanon Church.

Article 1st The church shall convene and hold her regular meetings monthly.

Article 2 Conference shall be opened and closed by prayer or praise.

- Article 3 It shall be the duty of each white male member to attend the conferences of the same and any member failing to do so shall at the next seceding conference render a reason for such nonattendance, if he shall fail to attend the second conference and render in his excuse as above the church shall cite him to the next conference.
- Article 4 In the absence of the moderator the church shall choose a moderator pro tem.
- Article 5 It shall be the duty of the Moderator
 1st to invite visiting Brethren & Sisters to seats with
 us
