THE WOMAN'S HOME MISSION SOCIETY.

IN 1886 the Woman's Home Mission Society of the ~~M. E. Church, South~~, came into existence as the "Woman's Department of Church Extension," the object of which was "to collect funds by private efforts, personal solicitations, and membership fees for purchasing and securing parsonages." Four years later she was known as the "Woman's Parsonage and Home Mission Society," with the liberty of "otherwise aiding the cause of Christ," granted to her constitution. In 1898 the General Conference enlarged her sphere, and she became the Woman's Home Mission Society ~~X~~ "under the supervision and direction of women, known as the Woman's Board of Home Missions of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, and consisting of a President, two Vice Presidents, a General Secretary, a Recording Secretary, and a General Treasurer, and a Corresponding Secretary, or alternate, of each Conference Society."

"Miss Lucinda B. Helm, of Elizabethtown, Ky., was the instrument used of God to call the organization into existence; and for twelve years, until the close of her life, she labored with unflagging zeal to guide and develop the growing work and to arouse the Church to its importance."

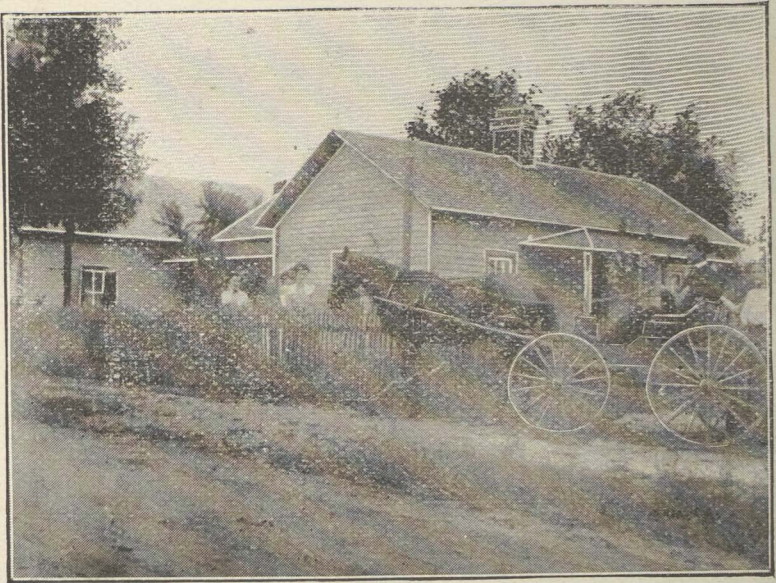
The work of the Society has grouped itself under various departments with the following records:

PARSONAGE DEPARTMENT.

Parsonages in needy sections have received aid from two sources—viz., from the Conference Societies and the General Board.

Each Conference Society has the privilege of using half of its dues to help parsonages within its own bounds, while the General Board disregards Conference lines and gives aid wherever it may appear to be most needed. It frequently happens that both Boards make grants to the same parsonages.

In the sixteen years of the existence of the Society 1,265 parsonages have been helped to the amount of \$117,384.23. Sixty parsonages have received benefit from the Loan Fund. Parsonages are granted loans from this fund at six per cent interest on sums varying from fifty to three thousand dollars, for periods not exceeding three years.

SUPPLY DEPARTMENT.

THERE are more than one thousand preachers in the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, whose salaries range from \$100 to \$300, and many of these have families. It is easy to see what a source of comfort the boxes of goods sent through the Supply Department have proved to many of these families. With a preacher's daughter, who has inherited a love and veneration for those who "bring good tidings and publish salvation," at the head of this department, it has grown to be one of the strongest of the work.

Through the wisely directed efforts of a Superintendent, assisted by the presiding elders, the name of every man in each Conference needing help can be secured. A blank asking for specific information concerning the family, the number of children, their sex and age, the most urgent needs of the household, and so forth, is sent to the mother. When this is returned, the Superintendent sends it to some willing auxiliary, and under the supervision of one or two wise-hearted women the box is carefully and quietly made up and sent out.

Since 1891 goods valued at \$44,921.06 have been thus directed to many heroes of the cross who fill what are called the "hard appointments."

SCHOOLS.

With the development of the Society it became apparent that educational work must be done to accomplish the greatest good and to reach the greatest number.

The Board maintains two schools for Cubans in Tampa, under the instruction of five teachers and two assistants, which have a pupilage of one hundred and eighty. In Ruth Hargrove Seminary, at Key West, there are two hundred and five children, under the instruction of nine teachers. This school is but three years old,

and the curriculum is so adjusted as to reach not only Cubans but our own American people. Were it not for this school, seventy-five or one hundred Protestant children would look to the Roman Catholic schools for instruction. In these schools effort is made to create a love for the true and the good, and to do away with the race memory of shiftlessness and hopelessness. The two excellent buildings at Tampa are valued at \$8,000, and that at Key West at \$11,000. The latter was built largely through the Twentieth Century Thank Offering.

In London, one of the mountain towns of Southeastern Kentucky, the Sue Bennett Memorial, a high-grade training school for teachers and the best youth of that section, has been in successful operation for six years. From two hundred and sixty to three hundred students annually attend this school; and of these, from fifty to seventy-five are normal students—district school teachers who, in their day schools and the Sunday schools which they organize and conduct, reach and instruct a student body of more than three thousand. The majority of this student body are children from the cabin homes and the coal mines that are reached by the Church in no other way. The value of this property is \$25,000.

For the destitute and orphaned children in the mountainous section of East Tennessee the Home Mission women of the Holston Conference, under the leadership of Mrs. E. E. Wiley, have established at Greeneville, Tenn., an industrial school and orphanage.

On the Pacific Coast the Board carries on night schools at Los Angeles, for Chinese; and at San Francisco, Oakland, and Alameda, for Japanese. Since the organization of these schools more than five hundred and fifty-nine students have been enrolled, and full three score have become Christians. This work appeals to the missionary spirit of the Church, especially since a convert from the Los Angeles school has returned to North China burning with a holy enthusiasm to tell his people of the Christ he found in America. Five teachers employed by the Board direct these schools.

At Dallas, Tex., the Ann Browder Cunningham Home and Training School furnishes refuge for those fallen girls who, like the prodigal son, would turn from sin and shame to the Father's love. As the name implies, it provides an opportunity for all who enter to prepare for some life of service whereby they may maintain themselves and thus restore self-respect and integrity of character. The capacity of the Home admits fifty girls with their babes. Value of property, \$15,000.

At Augusta, Ga., work has been commenced for negro girls in an annex to Paine Institute. It is proposed to give a rigid course in the domestic arts in which so many old-time "mammies" were so proficient, in connection with the literary and moral training which the times demand.

Two schools among the Choctaw Indians of Mississippi have been opened. Plans are being made for the development of these people, to whom we are so much indebted.

Work was begun among the coal mines of West Virginia in 1902. A night school at Eckman, a Sunday school at Eureka, and several good Home Mission Societies are among the tangible results.

CITY MISSIONS.

In line with the general policy of the Church, the women are authorized to organize city mission boards wherever there are two or more auxiliaries, three women from each auxiliary, with the pastor and presiding elder as advisory members, forming the board. No large work is projected without the consent of the Executive Board in annual session. The plan has grown in favor, and eleven cities have carried on successful missions. Most of them have employed a trained city missionary, who visits from house to house, getting into the home life and close to the hearts of the people; giving Bible readings and holding cottage prayer meetings; bringing the needs of the destitute and the sick to the notice of the Church^e people, and urging on parents and children the

importance of attending the services of the Church and Sunday school.

Free kindergartens, and industrial and night schools have been opened, and in one city a day nursery provided, where the children of working women can be cared for.

In Atlanta, Nashville, and Norfolk small beginnings have been made in settlement homes in needy sections, where the missionaries live in the very midst of destitution and sin, and through the continuous touch of friendship are enabled to reach the souls about them.

LITERATURE.

Our Homes is the official organ of the Society. It has a circulation of 6,587, and is ably edited by Miss Mary Helm. Two leaflets per month are issued for the use of the auxiliaries, and an annual report is sent throughout the Church each year.

TITHING DEPARTMENT.

A feature of the work which looks to a spiritual uplift of the constituents of the Society is that which stresses the giving of a tenth of the income to the Lord's work. Mrs. W. C. Ratcliffe has the department in hand, and through her earnest presentation of the scriptural and spiritual value of this method of filling the coffers of the Church 1,983 members of the Society have adopted the plan.

LOAN FUNDS.

The Board has raised and administered two funds, one for parsonage building and another for home mission work. The Parsonage Loan Fund is reserved wholly for temporary loans to parsonages. The Endowment Funds are vested funds, the interest of which is used for schools and city missions.

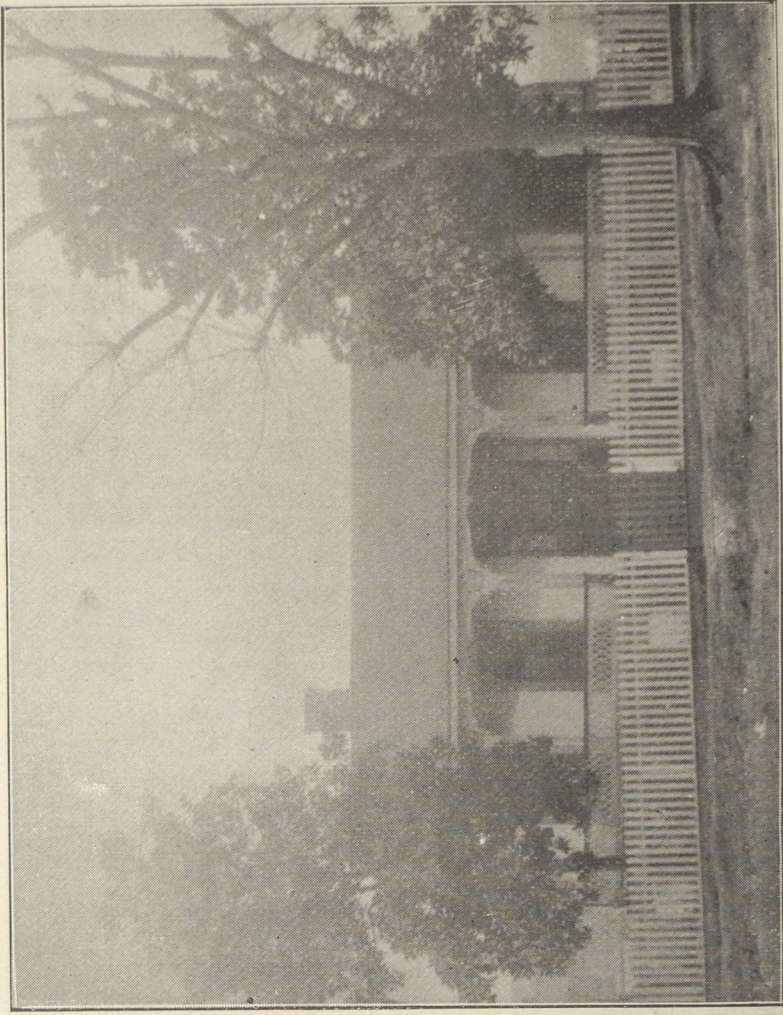
