DECISION

CARLYLE, Member: This case is before the Public Employment Relations Board (PERB or Board) on appeal by William Comi, University Professional and Technical Employees, et al. (UPTE), of the PERB appeals assistant's rejection of its statement of exceptions to the proposed decision of an administrative law judge as untimely filed.

The Board has reviewed the appeal, and finds that good cause does not exist to excuse the late filing.
