DECISION

BAKER, Member: This case is before the Public Employment Relations Board (Board) on appeal by the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, Local 2575 (AFSCME) from a Board agent's administrative determination that the determinations by the City of Antioch (City) regarding the decertification petition filed by Public Employees Union, Local One (Local One), were rendered in accordance with the Meyers-Milias-Brown Act (MMBA)¹ and the local rules of the City.
