## **DECISION**

DUNCAN, Chairman: This case is before the Public Employment Relations Board (PERB or Board) on Elizabeth Geismar's (Geismar) request for reconsideration of Marin County Law Library (Geismar) (2004) PERB Order No. Ad-338-M (Marin). In Marin, the issue was related to an untimely amendment to the unfair practice charge. Geismar filed a request for reconsideration in this case and in Marin County Law Library (Geismar) (2004) PERB Decision No. 1655-M. There was no differentiation in the request for reconsideration filed in the two cases.

Geismar did not set forth any grounds for reconsideration in either case. Because she has not set forth grounds for reconsideration as stated in PERB Regulation 32410,<sup>1</sup> the request for reconsideration is denied.
