Phase 2- Impact Grant Live Pitch on Wednesday, April 17th, 2024

Finalists for the impact grant will be notified at least two weeks before the pitch contest. Finalists will be <u>provided with a slide deck that they must use</u> for their live pitch. The live pitch will take place on Zoom from 4:30-6:15pm on Wednesday, April 17th, 2024. The judges are comprised of the active Women's Business Advisory Board Members. Each finalist will have five minutes to present their project and request for funding. There will then be a five-minute Q&A with the judges. The recipients of the grants will be notified at the end of the event.

Scoring

PHASE 1: The MTWBC Advisory Board will score each application using the scoring sheet below. The applications with the highest total scores will be the finalists.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF WOMEN IN AVIATION, ______ CHAPTER, [INC.]

Executed by the undersigned for the purpose of forming a non-stock, not-for-profit corporation under _______ of the ______ Statutes [adjust to include appropriate statutory reference under state law].

ARTICLE I Name

The name of the corporation shall be Women in Aviation, _____ Chapter, [Inc.] (the "Corporation").

ARTICLE II Purposes

The Corporation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable, scientific and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) [hereinafter, the "Code"].

Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles of Incorporation, the Corporation shall not conduct, carry on or engage in any activities not permitted to be conducted, carried on or engaged in by (a) an organization exempt from federal income taxation under Code Section 501(c)(3), or by (b) an organization contributions to which are deductible under Code Section 170(c).

Consistent with such limitations, the purposes of Chapter shall be to function as a chapter of Women in Aviation International, West Alexandria, Ohio. In that regard, the Corporation shall:

- Foster, promote and engage in aviation education, particularly as it relates to women in aviation.
- Cultivate, foster and promote interest and understanding among the public in the accomplishments and contributions of women to the aviation industry.
- Promote, encourage and facilitate membership in Women in Aviation, International and this Chapter.
- Support and promote the mission, vision, goals and objectives of Women in Aviation, International.


