Montana Apprenticeship  More info	Tax Credit	35+ hours a week year-round \$2000.  This state tax credit provides businesses financial incentive to launch new, or expand their current training programs through the Montana Registered Apprenticeship unit at the Montana Department of Labor & Industry.  • \$750 tax credit for each new apprentice, or;  • \$1,500 tax credit for each new apprentice that is a veteran;  • Tax credit takes effect once apprentice has completed probationary period or after 6 months, whichever is earlier;  The tax credit may be applied for each qualified apprentice's training program

Montana Cybersecurity Grant  More info	Grant	<ul> <li>Up to \$8,000 reimbursement grant to be used for:         <ul> <li>cybersecurity measures performed by a third party: security services, network security equipment, consumer security software, data security, cloud security, infrastructure protection, identity access management, real time threat response, integrated risk management, application security and training. Cyber Insurance is NOT eligible. Costs must have been incurred after November 15, 2022.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Eligible businesses must be registered and in good standing with the Montana Secretary of State or is a sole proprietorship. Must have at 5-50 employees and in business &gt;1 year and for profit. Montana Automation Loan Program  More info	Loan	The MT Department of Commerce Automation Loan Program is to assist businesses with the reduction of manual labor by updating or replacing production equipment that produces a product. This program is not designed to reduce the number of jobs but instead a reduction of manual labor by updating or replacing production equipment. The Department will provide an 0% loan for up to 50% of the purchase price of the automation equipment but not to exceed \$500,000.
Big Sky Trust Fund Planning Grant  More info	Grant	Planning funding is awarded for economic development planning activities in Montana for the following activities: support for business improvement districts including architectural and engineering fees; central business district redevelopment; industrial development; feasibility studies; preproduction costs for film or media. Up to \$27,000. Match required is \$1 for every \$1 awarded (1:1). Must apply through Prospera.
Montana SBIR/STTR Matching Funds Program  More info	Grants	The SBIR/STTR Matching Funds Program assists technology-based Montana companies by providing additional funding that can be used for technology development or other uses during the time that the company is working on a Small Business Innovation Research or Small Business Technology Transfer (SBIR/STTR) project with a federal agency. For eligible companies working on a project for a federal agency, Montana offers up to \$60,000 matching grant funds for Phase I and Phase II.
FAST 2023 Microgrants for SBIR/STTR Applicants  More info		MTIP (MT Technology Innovation Partnership) will award six FAST Microgrants to eligible SBIR/STTR applicants of up to \$2,000 per year. Prospective SBIR/STTR applicants may apply to MTIP to receive Microgrants to attend conferences, travel to speak with agencies or commercialization partners, to acquire consulting services from an approved service provider for assistance with preparation of Phase I or Phase II proposals, to develop supporting project data, and to undertake other activities directly related to their SBIR/STTR proposal.
Montana Women's Business Center Impact Grant More info	Grants	Any women owned business >51% ownership can apply for this grant of up to \$6,000. The grant opens annually on January 1 at prosperamt.org.
USDA Rural Energy for America Program Renewable Energy Systems & Energy Efficiency Improvement More Info	Grants and Loans	The goal is to provide funds to agricultural producers and rural small businesses for renewable energy systems or to make energy efficiency improvements. Agricultural producers may also apply for new energy efficient equipment and new system loans for agricultural production and processing. Open to small businesses in rural communities as well.
Montana Bioscience Cluster Initiative Grant Montana's 4th "F" Fund (4FF) More Info	Grants	The Montana Bioscience Cluster Initiative is offering funding to provide direct assistance to Montana bioscience entrepreneurs, startups, and small businesses. This fund is designed for maximum flexibility in support of new and established businesses and entrepreneurs in the bioscience industry. The fund will provide grants of \$250 to \$5,000. In exceptional circumstances the fund may consider larger applications. Grants may be awarded in phases (e.g. \$1,000 initially with

		additional \$1,000 on achieving specific milestone). Funds can be used for the following:  • Market research activities (including costs of trips to trade shows, potential customers or suppliers)  • Product design, prototyping or testing  • Patent searches or provisional patent applications  • Legal coststravel to key conferences  • small equipment purchases  • temporary staff assistance in relation to proposal development, etc.
Contractor's Gross Receipt Credit  More info	Tax Credits	Credit for people and businesses doing work under public contracts and paying the Contractor's 1% Gross Receipts Tax (CGR). This credit can offset the tax liability of individual income, corporate income, or alternative corporate income taxes and can be carried forward up to five years.
Energy Conservation Investments Deduction  More info	Tax Abatements	Tax abatement for capital investment in a building for an energy conservation purpose that is not financed by state, federal, or private grant funds for energy conservation. A deduction up to \$3,600 for nonresidential buildings may be available.
Historic Buildings Preservation Credit  More info	Tax Credits	An individual or business restoring a historic building (listed on the National Register) they own or lease in Montana. Up to 25% of the federal credit allowed. Credit is non-refundable and may be carried forward up to seven years.
Infrastructure User Fee Credit  More info	Tax Credits	Eligible businesses paying a local government infrastructure user fee financed through the Board of Investments. The total credit may not exceed the amount of the loan and the credit may be carried back three years then carried forward seven.
Qualified Endowment Credit  More info	Tax Credits	Credit available for people and businesses making charitable donations to a qualified endowment. 20% of a direct charitable gift made to qualified endowments or 40% of the present value of a planned gift, up to \$10,000. An endowment is a financial asset created by a donation made to a non-profit group or institution in the form of investment funds or other property that has a stated purpose at the bequest of the donor. Most endowments are designed to keep the principal amount intact while using the investment income from dividends for charitable efforts.
Recycling Credit More info	Tax Credits	Credit is for people and businesses collecting, manufacturing, and processing recycled materials.
Unlocking Public Lands Credit  More info	Tax Credits	Businesses and people providing access to public lands. Must be enrolled in the Unlocking Public Lands Program with the Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks. Credit is refundable providing \$750 for each qualified access up to \$3,000.
Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy	Financing	Commercial property assesses clean energy (C-PACE) is a tool that can finance

Research and Development  More info	Tax Exemptions	A Research and Development firm organized to engage in business in the state of Montana for the first time is not subject to state corporate income taxes on net income during its fir 5 taxable years of activity in Montana.
Northwestern Energy More info	Rebates	Natural gas, electric, lighting and Irrigation rebates as well as a E+ Business Partnership Program. Must be a NorthWestern Energy client.
Big Sky Film Grant More info	Grant	The Big Sky Film Grant Program builds and supports partnerships with filmmakers and production companies with the intention to create Montana film industry jobs. 50%+ of principal photography must be filmed in Montana.
Employee Retention Credit  More info	Tax Credit	The purpose of the ERC was to encourage employers to keep their employees on payroll during the pandemic. Businesses have until December 31, 2022 to apply for this tax credit. Must have W2 employees.

Growth Through Agriculture (GTA)  More info	Grant and Loan Program	A program to strengthen and diversify Montana's agricultural industry through the development of new agricultural products and processes. Examples of eligible project activities involve equipment purchases, advertising and promotion, tradeshow expenses, product development and testing, and consultant services.
USDA Value Added Producer Grant (VAPG)  More info	Grant	Helps agricultural producers enter into value-added activities related to the processing and marketing of new products. The goals of this program are to generate new products, create and expand marketing opportunities and increase producer income.
Specialty Crop Block Grant  More info	Grant	This grant enhances the competitiveness of specialty crops in either domestic or foreign markets and benefit crops grown in Montana.

Amber Grants for Women  More info	Grants	In 1998, we gave our first Amber Grant in honor of 19-year old Amber Wigdahl, who died before fulfilling her business dreams. Today, we award two \$10,000 Amber Grant each month. And two of our 24 monthly winners get an additional \$25,000 Year-End Amber Grant. It is an easy grant but VERY competitive, there is a \$15 application fee.
Cartier Women's Initiative Awards  More info	Grants	Cartier awards three grants to women-owned businesses in nine different regions around the world. The Cartier Women's Initiative Awards program is designed to support early-stage businesses that are focused on a range of social, economic and environmental development issues.  The first-place business is awarded a \$100,000 grant, second place receives \$60,000 and third place gets \$30,000. Winners also receive executive coaching and the opportunity to participate in a variety of training workshops. Very competitive.
FedEx Small Business Grant  More info	Grant	FedEx awards from \$10,000 - \$50,000 to 15 small businesses annually. Winners also receive money to use toward FedEx Office print and business services. The application requires an explanation of your business, how you'd use the money, photos of your business and — this part is optional — a short video explaining your business. To be eligible, you must operate a for-profit business with fewer than 99 employees and at least six months of operating history.
National Association for the Self-Employed Growth Grant  More info	Grant	This nonprofit trade association awards \$4,000 per month in growth grants to small businesses that can be used for a variety of business needs, including marketing, advertising and hiring employees.  To apply for this grant, you must be a NASE member in good standing for at least three months. Annual members can apply at any time.
Founded Outdoors Embark Program for Outdoor Brand Entrepreneurs  More info		Embark, a program developed in collaboration between REI Co-op Path Ahead Ventures and Founded Outdoors, is the place to launch your outdoor brand.
