

JUDITH ALLEN, Director, served for over two decades as the Associate Artistic Director for OpenStage Theatre and is an award-winning director, actress, and

designer. She most recently appeared as Princess Dragomiroff in Openstage's Murder on the Orient Express. Clairee in Steel Magnolias and is a recent recipient of the BroadwayWorld (Denver Region) nod for Best Supporting Actress for her role as Mattie Fae Aiken in August Osage County. Judi was the first recipient of the Shela Jennings Award for Theatre Excellence (OpenStage, 2017) and has directed OpenStage productions of Noises Off (OpenStage OPUS Award/Best Play and Best Director and Denver Post Ovation nominee/Best Comedy), The Drawer Boy (OPUS/Best Play and Best Director), and Romeo and Juliet (OPUS/Best Director) among others. Some favorite roles with OpenStage have been Chris in Neil Simon's Rumors (OPUS nominee and Denver Post Ovation Award/Best Supporting Actress) and the Nurse in the 2014 production of Romeo and Juliet (OPUS/Best Actress) Judi is also an award-winning makeup artist and the 2001 recipient of the OpenStage Founders' Award for outstanding contributions to the Company.



AMBROSE FERBER, Cyrano de Bergerac / Fight Director, returns to OpenStage for his first on-stage performance in 17 years, after playing Miles in The Drawer

Boy in 2005, also directed by Judith Allen. He served as Fight Director for Sherwood in 2021. Ambrose landed his first role when he was five, playing The Injured Boy in a Commedia Dell'arte his father wrote. Since then, he has performed throughout the southwest, recently as Benedick for Santa Fe's Shakespeare's production of *Much Ado* About Nothing, Earl of Kent in King Lear, and the Earl of Worcester in Henry IV Part 1. both for the International Shakespeare Center's Company. Other favorites include Picasso in Picasso at the Lapin Agile, John Hancock in 1776, and Lucas Brickman in Laughter on the 23rd Floor. Ambrose is also an accomplished fight director, with credits including Cyrano de Bergerac (a different one), Les Miserables, several Macbeths, Extremities, The Effect, and approximately 276 Romeo and Juliets. He has also appeared in several movies and television shows, usually playing some kind of cop. He currently resides in Santa Fe, New Mexico, with his wife, Bex, and their two amazing kids, Fiona and Sam. Ambrose dedicates this performance to his late father, who really loved Cyrano, and always wanted to see his son play the role somewhere other than the kitchen



ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT: EDMOND EUGÈNE JOSEPH ALEXIS ROSTAND



Edmond Eugène Joseph Alexis Rostand was born on April 1, 1868 in Marseilles, the eldest child and only son of a prosperous and cultured family. After a happy childhood and education at the lycée de Marseilles, Edmond moved to Paris to take his baccalaureate and study for his law degree. But he was determined to be a poet and never practiced law.

Staying in Paris after his studies, the would-be poet had, at first, little success. His first book of poems, *Les Musardises* (1890), only sold 30 copies. But he did meet Rosemonde Gérard, who also wrote poetry, and whom he married in 1890. An early attempt to write in prose for the theatre: a

farce, *Le Gant rouge*, written with Rosemonde's step-brother and performed at the Cluny Theatre in 1888, also failed to please. But Rostand did have a talent for the theatre, and when in 1894 the Comédie-Française put on Rostand's first verse play, *Les Romanesques*, as part of a triple bill, it was a great success. A lighthearted treatment of the Romeo and Juliet story with a happy ending. (The success of *Les Romanesques* continues to this day in the form of the musical, *The Fantasticks*). The amazing success of *Cyrano de Bergerac* at its premiere on December 28, 1897 was a triumph. Rostand's dream of reviving national pride with his hero's heroism, wit, and typically French panache was an unparalleled success.

Since then, Rostand's play has travelled all over the world and has been translated into almost every language. *Cyrano de Bergerac* has been translated to operas, musicals, films, parodies, and ballets. The romanticism of Cyrano along with his courage, integrity, and all out panache continue to touch and inspire audiences to this day.
