The Story of Elizabeth

Last week we learned that we can praise God and give thanks for His promises. Did you spend any time praising God last week? If so, what did you do?

READ Luke 1:57-60

What was so amazing about Elizabeth having a child?
Who was responsible for making the impossible happen in her life?

This child was to be named John and he was given to Zechariah and Elizabeth for a special purpose. Do you remember what that purpose was? **READ Luke 1:14-17** to help you remember.

Just like John had a purpose, you have a purpose, too. Do you believe God can and will do impossible things through you? Do you think He can help you live an extraordinary life of obedience and following Him? Do you think it’s possible for you to live a life of wisdom, kindness, goodness, gentleness, self-control and love even when you don’t feel like it?

Do you think it’s possible to act differently than your feelings through the power God gives—the power of the Holy Spirit? Have you ever experienced God’s power living in you and helping you do what’s right when you wanted to do what was wrong?
