\*Jon and Daryl presented a power point presentation on Innovative Justice Initiative mapping (outlining) what takes place from arrest to post conviction. (Copy attached) Jon gave a brief explanation on how the information was put together in the power point, starting back two years ago when a small unofficial group got together to discuss how costs could be saved/managed in our law & justice system, progressing to the September 2014 Law and Justice Council meeting when we heard about law enforcement and assisted diversion from King County, and the journey made to Hillsboro Oregon by a group of Thurston County officials to tour their Community Corrections Center.

\*Daryl briefly reviewed the LJAF research summary. (Copy attached)

\*Mark gave a brief update on the Triage facility. Bids for construction are in, construction should start in. This will be a ten bed, secured facility. Details being worked out on the role and function of the patrol officers, and also the eligibility for being admitted to the facility.

\*Daryl and Mark briefly discussed Providence Foundation is in communication with local criminal justice entities and social services to discuss the possibility of a one stop facility (social service center) where all needs can be met, housing program, employment, health clinic, etc. Cliff announce Providence will be briefing the Board of County Commissioners on October 1 at 3:00 pm if anyone would like to attend to learn more.
