# What do you need and why? Include any unexpected and external requirements.

Statement of Need

During the pandemic, the PAO sacrificed the then vacant Chief Criminal Deputy position to avoid other cuts in the operational capacity of the Criminal Division. The duties of the Chief Criminal Deputy were shifted to the Chief of Staff with some shifting to Team Leaders. In addition, the BOCC reduced the PAO budget by \$256,977 for the years of 2021, 2022, and 2023. As courts have re-opened and trial work has resumed, the workload on the Chief of Staff, the DPAs and other support staff in the Criminal Division has dramatically increased resulting in increasing burnout and turnover. In assessing the workload further, we determined that the Criminal Division needs the Chief Criminal Deputy restored to manage the day-to-day operations and support the work of the criminal DPAs and staff. This need is urgent and critical in our efforts to reduce the risk of burnout and continue to effectively prosecute current cases and backlogged cases.

## How will this change the performance of your office or department?

#### Statement of Need

Restoring the Chief Criminal Deputy will provide dedicated management support to DPAs and support staff in the Criminal Division as a strategy to manage organizational stress and improve performance, including providing training and mentoring resources. Maintaining adequate staffing levels within the PAO must be a priority so as to not weaken our ability to respond to crime and maintain public safety.

### Expenditure, FTE and revenue assumptions plus current budget level

#### Assumptions

Add Chief Criminal Deputy Prosecuting Attorney 1 FTE beginning January 2024.

#### Current Budget Level

The current budget for this position is zero. The Chief Criminal Deputy Prosecuting Attorney position is estimated to be \$203,964 for 2024 and \$210,269 for 2025. Salary savings as a result of hiring less experienced staff for the last three years provides ample savings to fund this position.

### What happens if this isn't funded? Are there other options?

#### Impacts and Alternatives

There is no alternative strategy to restore the Chief Criminal Deputy Prosecuting Attorney position without reducing essential capacity in another area of the office. Since 2020, the duties of this position have been absorbed by the Chief of Staff and Team Leaders, reducing their capacity within their teams. A less experienced workforce requires substantially more training and mentoring resources which can be provided by the Chief Criminal DPA, reducing the strain on the experienced attorneys and team leaders.
