What do you need and why? Include any unexpected and external requirements.

Statement of Need

The Parks and Trails program is requesting \$479K for the Burfoot Trail System Footbridge/Stairway project (CP #51077), to be funded by Real Estate Excise Tax 2 (REET2) funding, for a total revised project cost of approximately \$519K. The requested funding increase will move the project forward to the design and construction phases. Public Works is actively pursuing grant opportunities for this high priority safety project, which offset the amount of REET2 funding.

The existing trail system at Burfoot Park includes many footbridges and stairways that provide the connection from the main park area and parking lots, down to the Puget Sound waterfront. These wooden footbridges, stairways, handrails and retaining walls have all exceeded their life expectancy and have deteriorated to a point that they do not serve the volume of people who use this facility.

How will this change the performance of your office or department?

Statement of Need

Burfoot Park is one of the most heavily visited parks Thurston County offers with over 100k visits in 2022. The main attraction of the park is the access to the Puget Sound/Budd Inlet waterfront. The footbridge and stairway system that conveys park users to the waterfront has deteriorated over time and is in need of replacement. This project will restore safe access to the waterfront for park users. These improvements will also reduce the maintenance time and costs required to keep the current trails operational and to mitigate potential risk and safety hazards.

Project cost is based on a preliminary design project estimate originating from the predesign study. Costs will be refined during the design stage.

Current Budget Level

\$50,000

If this project is not funded, excess maintenance hours will be expended and other maintenance will be defferred. Additionally, the deteriorated footbridges and stairways may pose a safety hazard to park users.
