- **Arizona English Teachers Association Presenters**

On Sept. 19, three of Tolleson's librarians presented at the Arizona English Teachers Association Annual Conference. They discussed a variety of books that teachers can incorporate into their classroom instruction, including suggestions for book pairings of Own Voices modern novels with commonly taught literature. The three District librarians were Lynn Trembly from West Point High School, Nicole Benson from Tolleson Union High School and Courtney Moss from Sierra Linda.

Session 4b (30 minutes): A Face Like Mine: Connecting Classic Literature to Modern YA Books

A panel of five high school librarians will discuss the importance of diverse representation in high school libraries through Young Adult literature, with an emphasis on modern YA books that share similar themes and ideas as classic literature commonly taught at the high school level. We will discuss ways to incorporate modern YA books in with teaching classic literature in the classroom. Other topics to be discussed include books on mental health, LGBTQ representation, the importance of #OwnVoices, and the significance of book covers showing "a face like mine."





- **West Point Football Stadium wins award**


