#### **BEFORE YOU REGISTER**

- 1. If you are a new student your enrollment deposit and payment arrangements are due prior to registration.
- 2. Current students: Your account must be current to register. Log on to Self-Service to check the status of your account. If you have a stop that says Student Accounts or Payment, then contact the Student Accounts office to take care of your account.
- 3. If any of the following items are outstanding you will not be cleared to register:

  Admissions related documents if provisionally admitted (see Office of the Registrar)

  Immunization or insurance information (see Office of the Registrar)
- 4. Plan your schedule using a catalog or four-year layout from the year you started. A copy of the class schedule is attached; classes for spring semester can also be viewed on the Multnomah website (<a href="www.multnomah.edu">www.multnomah.edu</a>). Contact your faculty advisor if you need assistance in planning your schedule. New students contact the Office of the Registrar for assistance prior to your first semester.

#### SCHEDULE FOR REGISTRATION

Web registration will start at the times listed below for each group. Your registration time is based on your earned credits; it does not include credits that you are currently enrolled in. If you do not know how many credits you have earned, you can find out by viewing your "unofficial transcript" in Self-Service.

#### **Current Students**

Students who have completed 93 or more credits	November 3, 7:00 a.m.
Students who have completed 61 or more credits	November 5, 7:00 a.m.
Students who have completed 31 or more credits	November 10, 7:00 a.m.
Students who have completed 30 or fewer credits	November 12, 7:00 a.m.

#### **New Students**

New students will be able to register starting November 16 after they are admitted and have paid their enrollment deposit. Detailed instructions will be sent in mid-November.

#### **Returning Students**

Former students who are returning after an absence will be able to register between November 9 and January 8. Returning students need to contact the Admissions office to complete the re-enrollment process prior to being able to register.

#### **Close of Registration**

On-line registration will close for all students January 8 at 5:00 p.m. Late registration will open on January 11 for students who are not registered for classes. Late registration will take place at the Office of the Registrar between the hours of 9:00 and 4:00. Late registration cannot be done on-line.

#### **HOW YOU REGISTER**

Plan your schedule for next semester. Access Self-Service and register for your classes (Follow the directions on the attached page for web registration). The system will check to make sure that all prerequisites are met and that you do not have any schedule conflicts. During late registration come to the Office of the Registrar to register.

#### **IMPORTANT ITEMS TO NOTE (related to on-line registration)**

It is strongly recommended that you follow the course sequence as laid out on the four-year layouts for your program. These can be found at MyMU under Registrar, Advising, Course Plans (use this link <a href="https://multnomahuniversity.sharepoint.com/sites/MyMU/SitePages/Course-Plans.aspx">https://multnomahuniversity.sharepoint.com/sites/MyMU/SitePages/Course-Plans.aspx</a>) or from your department chair. Complete all first-year courses before taking second year courses, etc. This will prevent you from having scheduling difficulties in later semesters. Contact the Office of the Registrar if you have questions about this.

If you get an error message on one or more of the classes that you have selected to take, remove that class from your selections and save your other classes. If you believe that you should be able to take the class, contact the Office of the Registrar. We will review your situation and add the class if you qualify to take it.

Note about course fees: Some courses have a course fee in addition to tuition. You can find the fee amount by clicking on the course ID in Self-Service.

#### AFTER YOU REGISTER

Classes begin on Monday, January 11.

You should verify your class schedule by checking it in Self-Service prior to the first day of class. Report any errors to the Office of the Registrar by January 15.

#### Add/Drop

Students may add or drop courses at the Office of the Registrar or on-line Jan. 11-15. After Jan. 15 you may still withdraw from classes, but you must contact the Office of the Registrar to take care of this and there is a \$5.00 per course fee for registration changes after January 15. You may withdraw from classes until April 5. (Veterans and students receiving financial aid note limitations on Progress Standards.)

#### **Late Registration**

Late registration begins on Monday, January 11. January 15 is the last date to register. Late registration must be completed in person at the Office of the Registrar.

#### Web Registration Instructions for Self-Service

1. Log in to Self-Service.

**New students** - use the same user ID and password that you *just created* to access the Multnomah network.

**Continuing students** – contact IT (503.251.6555 or helpdesk@multnomah.edu) if you can't remember your password

#### New students only complete step 2, continuing students skip to step 3.

- 2. Select the Addresses section under the My Profile tab. A campus box number has been assigned if you are living on campus. Review your permanent address and verify that it is correct. If not, make changes and submit change. If you are not living in the residence halls, student apartments or at your permanent address, please create a secondary address and supply your current local address. If there are addresses displayed that are no longer valid, please delete them.
- 3. Now select *Register* tab and select *Traditional Courses* and move through four steps: Select period, Review schedule, Finalize and Complete (detailed below).
- 4. Select the period and then search for courses using Section Search. Make sure period and session are correct (i.e. Spring 2021 01). If you insert the first letter of the course designator in the Course Code field (i.e. B for Bib112 or T for TH 508) the computer will return a list of courses to choose from. Do *not* use the keyword search field. Add the courses that you want to your shopping cart by clicking on the *add* button. Do this before going on to another selection.
- 5. After each course selection, go to *Refine Search* on the left side of the screen to get your next class.
- 6. After you have selected your courses and they are in your registration shopping cart, you need to register for them. Do this by clicking on *Proceed to Registration* and confirm the courses listed then select *Next*. If all goes well, you will be registered for your courses and you can print out the page showing your schedule.
  - If you get an error message when you are registering your courses, you will need to correct the problem and then re-register your courses by marking the checkbox again and selecting *Next*. The system checks for time conflicts, pre-requisites and correquisites. If you believe you should be able to enroll in a course that the computer is not allowing, please register for all your other courses and then talk with one of the registrar's staff about the course that you could not register for.
- After you have completed the course registration process you should select *Finish*. This
  will finalize your schedule and cause the system to create your billing statement based
  on your registration. You can view your billing statement after you finalize your
  schedule.
- 8. Logout when you are done.
