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Program Description:

This course offers an environment to learn about collective trauma and the implications it can have on wellbeing. Participants will learn about situations that may elicit a collective trauma response, potential effects of collective trauma, and how collective trauma can impact the helping relationship process. Participants will also learn ways in which mental health professionals may be impacted when supporting survivors of collective trauma and elements that contribute to these challenges. Participants in this course will receive 1) an informational resource on collective trauma and its effects and 2) a therapy worksheet aimed at increasing a client's understanding of ways collective trauma may be impacting them.

Program Objectives:

- Demonstrate a basic understanding of the topic of collective trauma.
- Describe various psychological, relational, physiological, and spiritual effects that collective trauma can have.
- Articulate the ways in which collective trauma can impact the helping relationship and counseling professional.
- Implement ways to support clients during times/experiences of collective trauma.
