Program Description:

The course will focus on treatment of trauma using common evidenced-based, therapeutic approaches in the treatment of trauma such as EMDR, neurofeedback, prolonged exposure, and cognitive behavioral therapy. Discussion of current research regarding additional, helpful, trauma-specific treatment interventions along with spiritual integration will be discussed. A review of the neurobiology of trauma, brain development and its potential impact on health and well-being will be included. A good clinical assessment will also be discussed in choosing an effective treatment modality, based on the client's age and trauma history.

Program Objectives:

It is intended that because of this elective, the student will be able to:

- Identify and understand the major evidenced-based trauma-informed therapeutic interventions.
- Appreciate the importance of diagnosis and choosing the best therapy approach for the treatment of trauma-based disorders based on the client's unique history and presentation.
- Understand the neurobiology of trauma, brain development and potential impact of trauma on health and wellbeing.
- Gain knowledge and competence as a counselor in being able to effectively discuss and integrate one's spirituality into the healing process.
