- February 26, 2014 MOU (ACGME, AOA, AACOM)
- April 1, 2015 New sponsoring institution* applications
- July 1, 2015 AOA-approved program* applications
- July 1, 2015 Applications for Osteopathic Recognition
- June 30, 2020 AOA ceases accreditation



 - Specialty Program Agenda closing dates (these all vary)
 - Specialty RC meeting dates (Virtual meetings vary for the Spring 2020)
 - Specialty RC Meetings (Fall 2020 or Winter 2021 Meetings will review any remaining applications in Pre-Accreditation)



Application Process

Sponsoring Institution and Program Applications

- Applications for new SI or Programs on or before June 30, 2020
 - Pre-Accreditation Status
 - > Reviewed at Fall 2020 or Winter 2021 IRC or RC meetings
- Applications for new SI or Programs after June 30, 2020
 - > Beginning July 1, 2020, Single GME Accreditation System Transition has ended
 - Conventional ACGME Process

Institutions - Programs

Sponsoring Institutions - Programs in Pre-Accreditation*

- Institutional Review Committee or Specialty Review Committee will review at either a Fall 2020 or Winter 2021 meeting
- Accreditation Decision
 - Initial Accreditation
 - Accreditation Withheld
 - Institution or Program within 30 days receipt of Letter of Notification may request
 Appeal
 - Status of Sponsoring Institution or Program that appeals Accreditation Withheld under Appeal



Institutions

- Institutions <u>Continued Pre-Accreditation</u>* after Midnight June 30, 2020
 - Institutions with a status of <u>Continued Pre-Accreditation</u> will immediately change to Accreditation Withheld
 - Within 30 days of Midnight June 30, 2020, any Sponsoring Institution may request an Appeal
 - Status of an Institution that appeals Accreditation Withheld under Appeal



Programs

- Spring 2020 decisions on Programs: <u>Continued Pre-Accreditation</u>
 - Review Committee may
 - Award a program Initial Accreditation (with or without a site visit since the last decision on a program)
 - Defer an accreditation decision on Initial Accreditation until no later than the next fall or winter meeting
 - Maintain program a status of Continued Pre-Accreditation with no deferral of decision (if there has been a site visit since the last decision on a program)



Programs

- Programs in Continued Pre-Accreditation after Midnight June 30, 2020 (Have not been deferred)
- Programs with a status of Continued Pre-Accreditation will immediately change to <u>Accreditation Withheld</u>
 - Within 30 days of Midnight June 30, 2020, any Program may request an Appeal
 - Status of a Program that appeals Accreditation Withheld under Appeal

Appeals Process

- Subject: 19.00 Appeals of Adverse Accreditation Actions
 - Section: 19.10 Adverse Accreditation Actions for Programs and Sponsoring Institutions



Accreditation Actions

Adverse actions that can be appealed:

- Accreditation Withheld
- Probationary Accreditation
- Withdrawal of Accreditation
- Reduction in Resident Complement (not applicable to Sponsoring Institutions)



Appeal Process

IRC or RC confers an adverse action

- Notice of the adverse action to the program director and the DIO
- Letter of Notification sent to program director and copied to DIO
 - Includes the citations
 - Copy of the site visitor report (if there was a site visit)
 - Program director may appeal an adverse action
 - If a Program does not appeal, adverse action is final

Appeal Fee

Sponsoring Institutions or Programs that appeal

- An appeal fee shall be assessed (\$10,000.00)
- Appellant and ACGME shall equally share costs associated with the appeal
 - Cost of court reporter
 - Actual expenses for travel, meals, and hotel for the appeals panel and the RC Chair or designee



What happens to programs that have not achieved ACGME Accreditation by the end of the transition?



MOU Ends June 30, 2020

- AOA ceases accrediting programs
- AOA has restricted accreditation authority to allow residents to complete training
 - Includes residents from AOA Programs that <u>did not apply</u> for ACGME accreditation
 - Includes residents from AOA Programs that <u>applied</u> for ACGME accreditation but <u>have not</u> achieved ACGME accreditation (Institutions or Programs in <u>Pre-Accreditation</u> or <u>Continued Pre-Accreditation</u>)



What happens to residents in programs that do not achieve ACGME accreditation?



Agreement to Protect Residents

- ACGME, AOA, and AACOM agreement
- Provides protection for residents in AOA-approved training programs,
 which do not achieve ACGME accreditation prior to June 30, 2020 (Unique circumstances that may limit a residents ability to complete program by June 20, 2020)
- AOA will have restricted authority to extend AOA accreditation date
- Allows residents to complete training and be eligible for AOA Board Certification

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

Status of Resident Positions

- Increasing Number of Positions Available to Graduates
- Trend includes both the growth in ACGME-accredited positions and increases in positions traditionally accredited by the AOA




Status of Resident Positions

- Osteopathic graduates in ACGME-accredited programs
 - Doubled over four years (2015 2019)
 - 10,999 (2014-2015)
 - **34,051 (2019-2020)**
- Osteopathic graduates entering ACGME pipeline programs
 - More than doubled (2015-2019)
 - 2,930 (2014-2015)
 - 6,370 (2019-2020)










Status of Programs Applying For Accreditation and Osteopathic Recognition








Specialty and Subspecialty Programs



Non-Surgical*






Initial Accreditation with Warning






