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

There were various rooms with temperatures to complete the storage process in preparation for shipment completions. The building was set 10 feet above grade, with the rail and other transportation methods at 6 feet above grade. Completion of equipment pads for cooling equipment, along with mass grading and paving for the major roadways for trucks to the facility. The earthwork was balanced as value engineering opportunities to minimize import and off haul.

Port of Oakland, OAB Facility, Oakland, CA

The OAB facility was a project with major stakeholders consisting of the City of Oakland, Private Owner, JV with two major General Contractors. The project overview consisted of the construction and rebuilding of the roadway and rail infrastructure to the facility.
