Bullfrog

Rana catesbeiana

North America's largest
frog. Call is low, vibrato
“room room room”

Southern Leopard

Frog

Rana sphenocephala

Can be identified by white dot in the middle of their tympanum (located over the eye). Call sounds like the sound when you rub your finger over an inflated balloon.



C

Green Treefrog

Hyla Cinerea

Bright green frog with a well defined white stripe. Makes a nasal honking “quent” sound. Some say it sounds like cowbells at a distance.

Copes Gray Treefrog

Hyla chrysocelis

D

Skin is somewhat rough and warty. Call is a harsh rapid rill. Skin will be grayish and some variants include some green, usually on their backs.

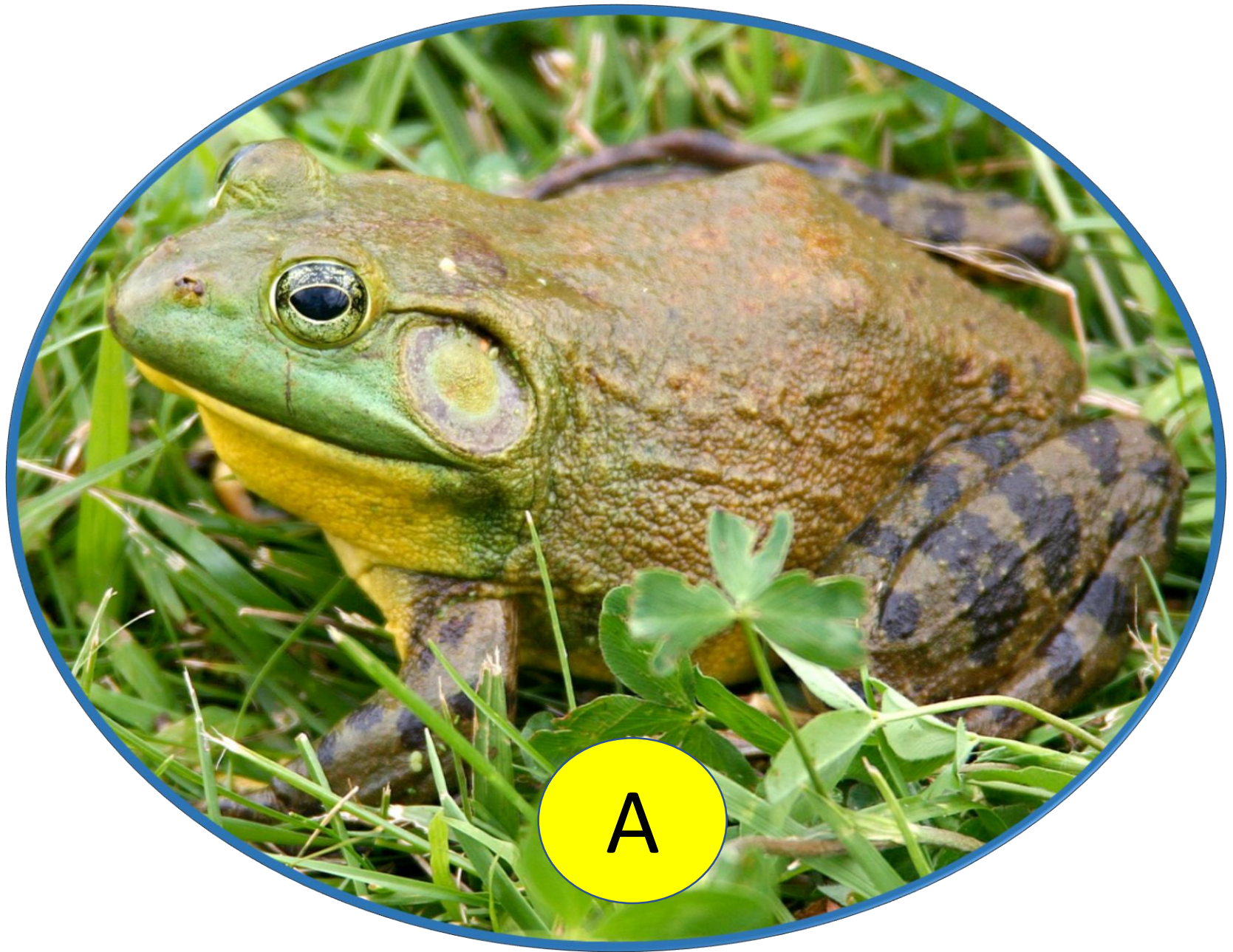

Spring Peeper

Pseudacris crucifer

A high, whistling “peep”. Tiny frog but very loud. Sounds like an ascending whistle. Has a distinctive X shape on it’s back.
