## WAKE COUNTY APPOINTMENTS POLICY

All citizens of Wake County are encouraged to volunteer to serve on boards, committees, commissions, and authorities. Unless specified by law, citizens may be appointed to two-year terms with a maximum service of three consecutive terms (six years) or a total of five terms (ten years) in any one appointed position. Citizens may only serve in two appointed positions in Wake County Government at one time.
