### A. PROPOSAL CONTENT

The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has unallocated funds for fiscal year 2021-2022 and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals (RFP). The available funds were set aside to fund the program types specified below. The Wake County JCPC seeks proposals for community-based programs targeting youth 6-20 years old who are referred from juvenile court services and/or youth ages 6-17 who are at-risk for delinquency and referred by other referral sources in Wake County. **A 30% match (in kind or cash) is required.**

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following program types (please follow the link for program type requirements in the DPS JCPC Policy Manual located at [NC DPS: Juvenile Crime Prevention Council Policy and Requirements and Procedures \(R&P\) Document](#)):

- Structured Activity Programs, focusing on
  - Vocational Development
  - Parent/Family Skill Building
  - Life Skills (specific to strategies for transitional and independent living skill development, including parenting skills for youth when appropriate)
  - Tutoring/Academic Enhancement
  - Mentoring
- Clinical Treatment Programs
  - Individual Counseling
  - Group/Family Counseling
  - Substance Abuse Counseling

Proposed program services should describe evidenced-based programs for youth and their families addressing one or more of the risks and needs factors listed below:

#### **Risk Factors**

- Gang involvement/association
- Substance use/abuse
- Moderate to serious school behavior problems
- Association with delinquent/gang involved peers
- Ineffective parental supervision/skills

#### **Needs Factors**

- Positive Peer associations
- Vocational training support
- Substance use treatment
- Effective parenting training
- School/educational connectedness

### B. PRIORITY CONSIDERATION

Programs that address the above referenced risk and needs factors and provide services in the Eastern part of Wake County will be given priority consideration.

### **C. PROPOSAL SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

2) Upload into NCALLIES (**Non-Profits ONLY**) the following documents: a) *No Over Due Tax Form*, b) *Notarized DPS Conflict of Interest Statement Template*, c) the non-profit's conflict of interest policy; and d) the non-profit's Proof of 501(c)(3) status. 5) Present their proposal(s) for funding to the Wake County JCPC on a date to be determined. Approved applicants will be notified of the date/time specified by the Council.

The deadline to submit proposals and necessary attachments is **5:00pm (EST), Wednesday, September 1, 2021**. Applications received after the deadline will be considered incomplete.
