Contact Big Sweep Zone Captain or park office directly to pre-register and to make sure the site is appropriate for your group. All volunteers must sign 1-2 liability waivers to participate — one for Wake County, and one for a partnering town or park. Dress for the weather and put safety first! Big Sweep cleanups may be cancelled and/or re-scheduled due to severe weather.

10:00am-12:00noon = Litter Cleanup on lake and along shore and foot trails;

After cleanup, Volunteer Appreciation Lunch provided by Foothills Brewing!

Walk 1/4 mile back to Thomas G. Crowder Woodland Center.

Clean up Lake Johnson as part of 2021 Craft Happiness Cleanup Project and Wake County Big Sweep with the City of Raleigh, Foothills Brewing of Winston-Salem, and Wake Soil & Water Conservation District. Volunteers will remove litter from the water, shore and trails. Volunteers can bring their own non-motorized boat with life vests/PFDs or borrow a boat from Lake Johnson on a first come, first serve basis. Children under 16 years of age must be accompanied by an adult 18 years of age or older in each boat.

Volunteers of all ages are welcome. Adults must register and accompany children under age 16. All volunteers must sign a release form (a parent or guardian must sign for each child.) Bring a water bottle and wear clothing that can get dirty/wet. Trash bags, gloves, grabbers, and data cards will be provided. Volunteers report to the Blue Jay Point Education Center, where they will receive supplies, data cards, information and maps to shoreline locations for litter removal. Big Sweep at Blue Jay is appropriate for ages 8yr and up – families, groups or individuals. Volunteers under the age of 16 must be part of an organized group with a participating adult supervisor or be accompanied by a guardian.
