
Start by selecting 'PSE Site Activities' from the 'Track' drop-down menu







Navigate to the Needs, Readiness & Effectiveness Section using the panel on the right-hand side.











The Test Elementary School has a strong wellness policy, but many aspects of the policy were not implemented at the time of this assessment. The school environment appears to support ongoing physical activity for all students throughout the year. On the other hand, the school environment does not provide adequate support for healthy eating choices (e.g., unhealthy foods in vending machines, few vegetables available in lunchroom, etc.). We received great support from Test Elementary Staff in using the SLAQ, and we're excited to work together moving forward.


