

## KING and QUEEN

The race to be named King or Queen of the Crankworx World Tour is the most difficult competition in mountain biking. This season-long, multidisciplinary challenge tabulates results from multiple event disciplines in a four-stop, epic test of a rider's skill and will. Racing from the Alps to the Southern Hemisphere, athletes aim to collect as many points as possible for a shot at winning the \$20,000 prize. The most points wins.

### **TITLES / PRIZE MONEY**

The top ranked athletes competing at the Crankworx World Tour are recognized through the following title and awards.

**King and Queen:** the two top ranked riders (male and female): \$20,000 CAD each

**2<sup>nd</sup>** place overall riders (male and female): \$10,000 CAD each

**3<sup>rd</sup>** place overall riders (male and female): \$5,000 CAD each

Titles/Awards will be presented on July 28, 2024, at Crankworx Whistler.

\*A minimum of two Crankworx Festivals in 2024 need to occur in order for the King and Queen title to be awarded\*

### **ELIGIBILITY**

A rider must compete and collect points in at least 2 disciplines in order to be eligible to win a title/award.

Only riders competing in the Pro Men or Pro Women categories will be eligible.

### **EVENTS**

Titles/awards will be based on results in the following individual events at Crankworx Summer Series NZ, Crankworx Rotorua, Cairns, Innsbruck and Whistler.

### TIE BREAK

In the event of a tie for total points at the end of all relevant Crankworx World Tour competitions, the following rules will be used in the following order until the tie is broken:

- The most first place finishes, or if still tied, the most second place finishes, or if still tied, the most 3rd place finishes, or if still tied,
- Head-to-Head results in all common races/competitions if applicable.
- In the event the tie cannot be broken using the above rules, the title and prize money will be divided.
