

Do We Really Believe? (Personal Words)



- #1) The concept of Treaties.
(We've let the enemy move in through bad beliefs)**
- #2) Do you FULLY / REALLY Believe that Bible teaches that Healing is for today, and is for you?**
- #3) Do you know the Scriptures well enough that you could teach on healing?**

#4) Do you Know you OWN the promises? (Title Deed)

#5) You are the one who DEMANDS what will be according to the Word, because YOU OWN IT.

#6) The Keys to DEMANDING are Binding and Loosing.

#7) Not Being SURE or being Double-Minded won't work.

#8) Ask the Holy Spirit to CONVINCЕ you. (Rhema)

From my perspective, there are 2 levels of believing:

- 1. The General Basis that healing is for us according to what the Written Word says. (Rhema on it)**
- 2. The Specific thing(s) God has said to us about our situation or condition - (personal Rhema Words)**

Matthew 4:10 (NKJV)

[10] Then Jesus said to him, “Away with you, Satan! For it is written, ‘You shall worship the LORD your God, and Him only you shall serve.’”

Matthew 8:3 (NKJV)

[3] Then Jesus put out His hand and touched him, saying, “I am willing; be cleansed.” Immediately his leprosy was cleansed.

Matthew 8:26 (NKJV)

[26] But He said to them, “Why are you fearful, O you of little faith?” Then He arose and rebuked the winds and the sea, and there was a great calm.

Matthew 9:6 (NKJV)

[6] “But that you may know that the Son of Man has power on earth to forgive sins”—then He said to the paralytic, “Arise, take up your bed, and go to your house.”

Matthew 9:29 (NKJV)

[29] Then He touched their eyes, saying, “According to your faith let it be to you.”

Mark 4:39-40 (NKJV)

[39] Then He arose and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, “Peace, be still!” And the wind ceased and there was a great calm. [40] But He said to them, “Why are you so fearful? How is it that you have no faith?”

Mark 7:34 (NKJV)

[34] Then, looking up to heaven, He sighed, and said to him, “Ephphatha,” that is, “Be opened.”

Luke 4:35 (NKJV)

[35] But Jesus rebuked him, saying, “Be quiet, and come out of him!” And when the demon had thrown him in their midst, it came out of him and did not hurt him.

Luke 4:39 (NKJV)

[39] So He stood over her and rebuked the fever, and it left her. And immediately she arose and served them.

Luke 7:14 (NKJV)

[14] Then He came and touched the open coffin, and those who carried him stood still. And He said, “Young man, I say to you, arise.”

Luke 9:42 (NKJV)

[42] And as he was still coming, the demon threw him down and convulsed him. Then Jesus rebuked the unclean spirit, healed the child, and gave him back to his father.

John 5:7-8 (NKJV)

[7] The sick man answered Him, “Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; but while I am coming, another steps down before me.” [8] Jesus said to him, “Rise, take up your bed and walk.”

John 11:43 (NKJV)

[43] Now when He had said these things, He cried with a loud voice, “Lazarus, come forth!”

John 17:18 (NKJV)

[18] “As You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world.

John 20:21 (NKJV)

[21] So Jesus said to them again, “Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you.”

John 14:12-13 (NKJV)

[12] “Most assuredly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do he will do also; and greater works than these he will do, because I go to My Father. [13] “And whatever you ask in My name, that I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son.

John 15:8 (NKJV)

[8] “By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit; so, you will be My disciples.

Acts 9:40 (NIV)

[40] Peter sent them all out of the room; then he got down on his knees and prayed. Turning toward the dead woman, he said, “Tabitha, get up.” She opened her eyes and seeing Peter she sat up.

Acts 14:8-10 (NIV)

[8] In Lystra there sat a man crippled in his feet, who was lame from birth and had never walked. [9] He listened to Paul as he was speaking. Paul looked directly at him, saw that he had faith to be healed [10] and called out, “Stand up on your feet!” At that, the man jumped up and began to walk.

Acts 16:18-19 (NIV)

[18] She kept this up for many days. Finally, Paul became so troubled that he turned around and said to the spirit, “In the name of Jesus Christ I command you to come out of her!” At that moment, the spirit left her.

[19] When the owners of the slave girl realized that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace to face the authorities.

Acts 19:13 (NIV)

[13] Some Jews who went around driving out evil spirits tried to invoke the name of the Lord Jesus over those who were demon-possessed. They would say, “In the name of Jesus, whom Paul preaches, I command you to come out.”

What are Personal Rhema Words?

1. Receiving a Rhema on the General Promises of the word is simply the Holy Spirit leading us, guiding us, teaching us, counseling us, revealing to us, being our Paraclete / Helper so that we Believe / have Faith.

2. Receiving a Rhema on an issue you are personally dealing with is when the Holy Spirit takes the General Promises and speaks to us / applies them to our specific situation and leading us, guiding us, teaching us, counseling us, revealing to us, being our Paraclete/ Helper so that we Believe and have Faith.

John 1:48 (KJV)

[48] Nathanael saith unto him, Whence knowest thou me? Jesus answered and said unto him, Before that Philip called thee, when thou wast under the fig tree, I saw thee.

John 4:17-19 (KJV)

[17] The woman answered and said, I have no husband. Jesus said unto her, Thou hast well said, I have no husband:

[18] For thou hast had five husbands; and he whom thou now hast is not thy husband: in that saidst thou truly.

[19] The woman saith unto him, Sir, I perceive that thou art a prophet.

John 4:29 (KJV)

[29] Come, see a man, which told me all things that ever I did: is not this the Christ?

John 9:6-7 (KJV)

[6] When he had thus spoken, he spat on the ground, and made clay of the spittle, and he anointed the eyes of the blind man with the clay,

[7] And said unto him, Go, wash in the pool of Siloam, (which is by interpretation, Sent.) He went his way therefore, and washed, and came seeing.

Acts 9:3-6 (NIV)

[3] As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him.

[4] He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, “Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?”

[5] “Who are you, Lord?” Saul asked. “I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting,” he replied. [6] “Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do.”

Acts 10:3-6 (NIV)

[3] One day at about three in the afternoon he had a vision. He distinctly saw an angel of God, who came to him and said, “Cornelius!”

[4] Cornelius stared at him in fear. “What is it, Lord?” he asked. The angel answered, “Your prayers and gifts to the poor have come up as a memorial offering before God. [5] Now send men to Joppa to bring back a man named Simon who is called Peter. [6] He is staying with Simon the tanner, whose house is by the sea.”

Acts 10:9-17 (NIV)

[9] About noon the following day as they were on their journey and approaching the city, Peter went up on the roof to pray. [10] He became hungry and wanted something to eat, and while the meal was being prepared, he fell into a trance.

[11] He saw heaven opened and something like a large sheet being let down to earth by its four corners. [12] It contained all kinds of four-footed animals, as well as reptiles of the earth and birds of the air. [13] Then a voice told him, “Get up, Peter. Kill and eat.”

[14] “Surely not, Lord!” Peter replied. “I have never eaten anything impure or unclean.”

[15] The voice spoke to him a second time, “Do not call anything impure that God has made clean.”

[16] This happened three times, and immediately the sheet was taken back to heaven.

[17] While Peter was wondering about the meaning of the vision, the men sent by Cornelius found out where Simon's house was and stopped at the gate.

Acts 13:2-3 (NIV)

[2] While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." [3] So after they had fasted and prayed, they placed their hands on them and sent them off.

Acts 13:8-9 (NIV)

[8] But Elymas the sorcerer (for that is what his name means) opposed them and tried to turn the proconsul from the faith. [9] Then Saul, who was also called Paul, filled with the Holy Spirit, looked straight at Elymas and said,

Acts 13:11-12 (NIV)

[11] Now the hand of the Lord is against you. You are going to be blind, and for a time you will be unable to see the light of the sun.”

Immediately mist and darkness came over him, and he groped about, seeking someone to lead him by the hand. [12] When the proconsul saw what had happened, he believed, for he was amazed at the teaching about the Lord.

Acts 20:22-23 (NIV)

[22] “And now, compelled by the Spirit, I am going to Jerusalem, not knowing what will happen to me there. [23] I only know that in every city the Holy Spirit warns me that prison and hardships are facing me.

God-Faith: Believing what God has said and not believing the Kingdom of Darkness.

Fear-Faith: Believing what the Kingdom of Darkness has said and not believing what God has said. (Scripture calls that unbelief).

God says we can be healed.

Kingdom of Darkness says everything but.....

God says he wants us to spread the gospel.

- make decisions by fear**
