HONOR Placing a High Value

Honor - G5091 (Strong's)

"from 5093; to prize, i.e. fix a valuation upon; by implication, to revere:--honor, value."

Honor - G5091 (Thayer's)

"to estimate, to fix the value; mid. to fix the value of something belonging to one's self"

Honor - H3513 (Strong's)

"or kabed {kaw-bade'}; a primitive root; to be heavy, i.e. in a bad sense (burdensome, severe, dull) or in a good sense (numerous, rich, honorable; causatively, to make weighty"

Honor - H3519 (Strong's)

"... from 3513; <u>properly, weight</u>, but only figuratively in a good sense, <u>splendor</u> or copiousness:--<u>glorious(-ly)</u>, glory, honour(-able)."

Some of my own thoughts on placing a High Value:

- We spend time on it / with it.
- We take care of it.
- It has a high priority in our lives.
- We "revere" it / the person.

(Webster: "to show devoted deferential honor to: regard as worthy of great honor")

- If it's a person, we want to please them / nurture the relationship.
- We spend considerable money on it / them.
- We are troubled / frustrated when we can't spend the time with it / them that we'd like.
