## Howard Pittman was personally rebuked for being Selfish.

His life on earth was called an abomination, because most of what he did was for himself.

#### Five points for the church:

#1) This is the Laodicean church age in which we live today.

The overwhelming majority of so-called Christians are, just that, so-called. Mouth professors, but not heart possessors. Unless they wake up, he will spew them out of his mouth.

# #2) Your adversary is a personal and powerful adversary. Satan the devil. He is anointed.

#3) If you ever want God's power to manifest in your life, you have to live the life. You have to walk it, not talk it.

#4) As it was in the days of Noah, so shall it be in the days of the coming of the son of man.

We have reached the days of Noah once again.

In the Bible and history it describes the days of Noah as man having two priorities: "Wealth and Pleasure".

Everything else is secondary.

## #5) This is the main point that he sent him back for. Matthew 3:11-12.

The baptism of the Holy Spirit is going to come with Fire. He's going to burn up the chaff in Christians. This is the real evidence of the baptism of the Holy Spirit. That process is going to take tribulation.

# The true baptism of the Holy Spirit will bring Fire into the individuals life. The purposes to burn out the chaff.

#### Is our primary motivation:

Depending upon how this affects me, I'm either interested or not interested.

### How our decisions affect other people, is not our concern.

### Is it a struggle when something inconveniences us?

Especially if it's inconvenient for:

our plans for fun, entertainment, enjoyment, our money, etc. (Days of Noah)

### How willing are we to lay our life (psuche) down for someone else?

Psuche:
Our will,
Our mind,
our emotions.
