1. Increase(HEB) = Exceed, grow continue to add over and above.

- 2. Augment = Make something greater by adding to it
 - A. To supplement
 - B. To enlarge, expand and multiply

- 3. Psalm 115:14 Commentary from the Tehillim:
 - A. "May HASHEM add upon you, upon you and your children.
 - B. "These words provide a most accurate description of th true nature of blessing. Blessing means increase and abundance, whereas the closest definition of curse, is decrease and loss.

- 4. God has no problem increasing us.
 - A. Psalm 35:27: "Let them shout for joy, and be glad, that favour my righteous cause: yea, let them say continually, Let the Lord be magnified, which hath pleasure in the prosperity of his servant."
 - B. Luke 12:32: "Fear not, little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom."

- 5. God has no problem with increasing our children.
 - A. Proverbs 13:22: "A good man leaveth an inheritance to his children's children: and the wealth of the sinner is laid up for the just."
 - B. Psalm 112:1-2 (NLT): "Praise the Lord! How Joyful are those who fear the Lord and delight in obeying his commands. Their children will be successful everywhere; an entire generation of godly people will be blessed.
