ARE WE ROBOTS?



DO YOU SOMETIMES FEEL LIKE A ROBOT? When you're staring into a screen and pressing buttons, do you feel like you are controlling your device, or do you feel like your device is controlling you?

This is one of the ideas behind *The Disks*, a colorful painting by the French artist Fernand Léger. At first glance, it might look like a beautiful abstract painting, but look a little longer and you'll notice there are human or android figures that appear to be walking through the center of the picture. Those colorful shapes might also start to look like the wheels in a machine, with levers or handles that you pull down to make everything work. Are we looking at humans or machines? Or a mash-up of both?

THIS PAINTING WAS MADE OVER 100 YEARS AGO,

when new technology was shaping a modern age—kind of like today!

Use lines, dots and geometric shapes like circles, squares, rectangles, triangles, and cylinders to create a combination human-robot or contraption-person. Or draw a fantastic machine that makes some of your favorite things!

Give your invention a name and a little backstory, then show your drawing to a friend and tell them all about it.
